## NOTICE

By a vote of the Corporation, each student whose dues to the University remain unpaid on the day fixed for their payment is required at once to cease attending lectures or recitations, using the libraries, laboratories, gymnasium, athletic grounds or buildings, boarding at Memorial Hall, at Foxcroft Hall, or at the Freshman Halls, and making use of any other privileges as a student, until his financial relations with the University have been arranged satisfactorily to the Bursar. Failure to comply with this rule is deemed cause for separation of the student from the University. A student in Harvard College who is deprived of his privileges for non-payment of dues is liable for a special fee of ten dollars upon his re-instatement.

Students who are candidates for degrees in the middle of the academic year must pay all dues to the University, not later than February 21, 1917.
