I have at least half an hour to spare so I thought I'd write to you or at least attempt to get a good start.

How was your trip home and how is she getting along? As far as I am concerned, everything seems to be in the same level as the time you were here, except I feel more irritated these days because of the dorm life. What makes me angry is that they keep letting Americans in the single rooms and continue to ignore us. However, the work is getting a little better, that is, I get to do a little more of what I like.

Wakako called me up last Wednesday night and she mentioned that she would like to get in the dorm, but had to tell her that the dorm was full. Just as soon as there is an opening I'm going to call her up and let her know. If she comes I know I'll be quite contented even in the dorm. When you left I became so homesick that I wanted to go home too. After I work here a month or two more I believe I will get enough annual leave accumulated to go home or rather to Amache for a few days.

Mr. Lindley was up first part of the week and just this morning Mr. McClelland dropped in. Tosh Ninomiya and the girl who looks like a Spanish were in town this week. When is Mr. John J. O. Moore ever going to come up?

*S.P.M. Same day:*

*Sorry I couldn't finish this letter at the office. Too many people started to come in so I just couldn't continue. Mr. Hamilton was in this afternoon and it really feels good to see people like him. I'm hoping that they would have conferences more often so that people from the camp would be coming up. That "Happy-go-Lucky", Ed Kade was up at the office saying that "they really caught up with me." However, he had had an indefinite leave.*

*Last night I went to a movie & saw the "Amazing Mrs. Holliday with Helena" and it was quite good, but I liked "Prize of the Yankees" - Ruby Cooper & Theresa Wright - lol better. Tonight I'm sitting here at home 3*

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with nothing to do but write to you and a few letters. I could  
iron and wash, but I'll let it go another night.

I'm thinking about living some place else, but I'm afraid  
that I'm going to regret it later because I know I'm going to  
get lonesome and the more lonesome I am the more homesick and  
gloomy I'm going to get. But if I stay here too long in the  
same circumstance I'm going to get crazy. Another thing I'm  
worried about is that I may get a ~~single~~ room & have  
to double up with someone I don't know. I wouldn't mind it  
if that girl from Aunt, I'dad & I are the only ones here  
but too many dominating women close together being lots of  
disharmony which makes life very unpleasant for me.  
Well, I'm making the best of it and never had any quarrels  
yet. That is the last thing I'd ever do and to avoid it I  
think I should live away from them. But, as I said, I'm  
afraid I'm going to be lonesome and as it's going to be in-  
convenient because it's quite far from town.

I meant to call up Shaketa tonight, but a  
girl had a long distance telephone call through so  
I couldn't but hope <sup>to</sup> tomorrow night.

I have to tell you a funny incident which happened last  
Tuesday. A totally strange boy from (name) was up at  
the office to see Mr. Choate and Mr. Robinson and somehow  
he started to talk to me and before I had a chance to say more  
than 15 words he asked to have a ~~talk~~ lunch with him. I made  
up a very good excuse to get out of it but it didn't work. I was  
sure that Harry would with me because he was a stranger to me.  
He ordered a Turkey Dinner, but I had no appetite because he was such a  
mean and ill-mannered boy. I nearly didn't tell him I'd go but  
he just followed us and he paid so that was that. Gosh, I thought  
South Atlantic was "fast" but he was a "northerner". If anyone saw  
me with a boy like that it would have been a scandal. This is one  
experience I can't forget for a long time.
