I have a large county with a lot of rural communities, & it means lots of driving, but I enjoy that. Caldwell is a small, conservative "college town". There's not much doing here, as far as recreation is concerned - but I get in to Boise for an occasional week-end & that helps out.

I have a nice comfortable little apartment, & enjoy keeping house after a year of eating around in restaurants, & living in a tiny little room.

My major difficulty here is keeping track of the time - & I mean that literally. Half of the county is on War time & the other half on the old time. The office runs on War time, while Caldwell is on slow time. I'm forever getting my appointments mixed up. I have to designate which time I'm going on when I make an appointment with anyone. I keep my watch on Caldwell time, but have to sign in & out of the office & keep mileage records on war time. What a headache!

I haven't seen Orill Lewis - the supervisor in Adams county - since I got back. Her county is away north of here, & mileage restrictions being what they are, I don't get to take long trips. I don't suppose anything

has been done about getting a
social worker for the camp, or
she would have written me.

I expect, when it comes right
down to it, that the situation
