It seems such a long time since last Tuesday when I left you. How are you?

Have been extremely lucky about train schedule and accommodations - sat all the way in to Phil. tho' we made numerous stops along the B. & O. system.

The biggest surprise came to me when I learned that the train would go through Phila. via Washington D.C. and Baltimore. Had no time to let Kan know, so I took a chance of getting off at Baltimore station. Believe me, I found Kan's place as easily as my coming home.

Stayed with Kan (Simon's home) for two nights. The day in between (Sat.) we went to Washington D.C. - one hour away - and saw few sights. Unfortunately it was raining and snowing. Visibility was very poor from Washington monument. Saw the Lincoln memorial, white house, Potomac River and Sout. Bldgs etc. Took in a Chinese dinner (lousy) and show "In our Time".

Remember that umbrella I carried? I couldn't get rid of it all the way. At even a station refused to

check it. The weather was beautiful all along.
The Baltimore station checked it and as the
station was some distance from where we were,
I didn't pick it up. So, it rained bells bell
and snowed - we were without umbrellas.
Sunday 12.31 I left Baltimore, but attended a
Quaker Friends meeting before leaving. Had 10 minutes
left to go 2½ miles to depot - and a taxi came
along! Made it.

Reached Phil. yesterday noon. Stayed over at

on Patterson today and go on to New Haven
direct via N.Y.
