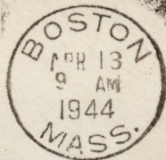

Darling, you will be able to look at the whole situation in a more tangible way when you get out here. This matter of adjustment isn't too easy under the best of conditions

and you will possibly find out
after being out for some time that
perhaps it was best that you come
alone.

For myself, I wished I were able
to be more positive about myself.
As yet, there is nothing in the
offering along my interest. Today, I
went to U.S. E. S. and said that
I'd want a non-essential job until
something turned up. That is to say,
take courses at Harvard or Boston U.
to improve my background and do
my own job hunting into companies
I really want to get into.

Tomorrow, I'm going to Providence
to meet a Dr. Clarke for interview.
Friday - have 10⁰⁰ AM appointment to
see personnel mgr. of a defense job.

As I said before there are jobs
but somehow the people want to
find something up to my training

and education, which is a slow process.
In the meantime, its Spring and I'm
getting restless - for you darling.

Kan has been here since Friday
and has been looking into the job
situation here. So far, there is nothing
in the offering along architecture
