Dear Yuri:

Honey, how was your trip? Were you lucky about getting seats and making connections?

Later when you get all rested up you can write to me about the trip a millions better - tell me.

Just now I want to say something about your Philadelphia job offer in terms of what Boston has to offer.

As you know, Mr. Harris was taken into the Navy some time ago and since then the U. R. A. has not done any thorough contacting for you. Last Friday, Miss Reynolds said that she is trying to line up several institutions where you can go for an interview. To me, merely calling

up on institutions and making
appointments for you ^{aren't} ~~aren't~~ enough.
Should you be turned down, the
office could offer you poor substitutes.
Critically, Mr. Clapp's idea of needing
to establish local reference can be
carried too far. The tendency is to
push a person into a job. (the arguments
for this have pro & con)

Darling, it isn't much fun for me
to say it, but when I think about
our future plan, I think you should
take the Philadelphia offer. That is,
if the offer is attractive to you.

A Philadelphia social worker
reference would be better in Boston
than to come here now, not get a
job in an agency and then be forced
by necessity to push a pencil, "waiting
for a break."

Mr. Clapp, saying that you get such
and such an offer and whether
Boston could give a better offer.
Under the circumstance, I wouldn't know
whether it would be advisable, ^{for you} to
come here just now because I do not

lined up as yet - methinks they feel that

want to see you. Truly, I'm just on
edge to be with you again. Yumi. I've
so much to say and talk over plans
for the future - for both of us. If it
is the choice of seeing you now and
making one sided plans or wait until
you get the "feel" of the place and
plan together, - the latter would accomplish
so much more.

I want you to know that any
decision you make is OK with me.
Dearest, ^{just} now on we can actually make
the real, real plan for the future. The
road is rugged and it will be tough
climbing. It's up, up toward our Heaven of
Happiness - for you and me.

Please let me know your address
right away, darling.

I'm starting on my new work tomorrow.
It is in a small precision tool manufacturing
company in South Boston. So maybe, both of
us will begin working at about the same
time. Thus, to think that I spent the
whole 6 weeks away from you when I could
have spent it with you, come out together and
find jobs at the same time!

Good nite darling. You'll be very busy
the next few days but please save a place
for my love for you - a big, big space.
