† UNITS.—Amount of University credit is reported in terms of standard semester units.

‡ GRADES.—A, excellent; B, good; C, fair; D, barely passing. Grades E and F are deficiencies. There is no provision for the removal of a deficiency in an Interession or Summer Session course by supplementary work or examination, or in any other manner save by repetition of the entire course.

Grade points, or quality units, will be assigned as follows: grade A, three points per unit; B, two points per unit; C, one point per unit; D, no points per unit; E or F, minus one point per unit. (Provision for negative grade points to be effective in and after August, 1923.)
