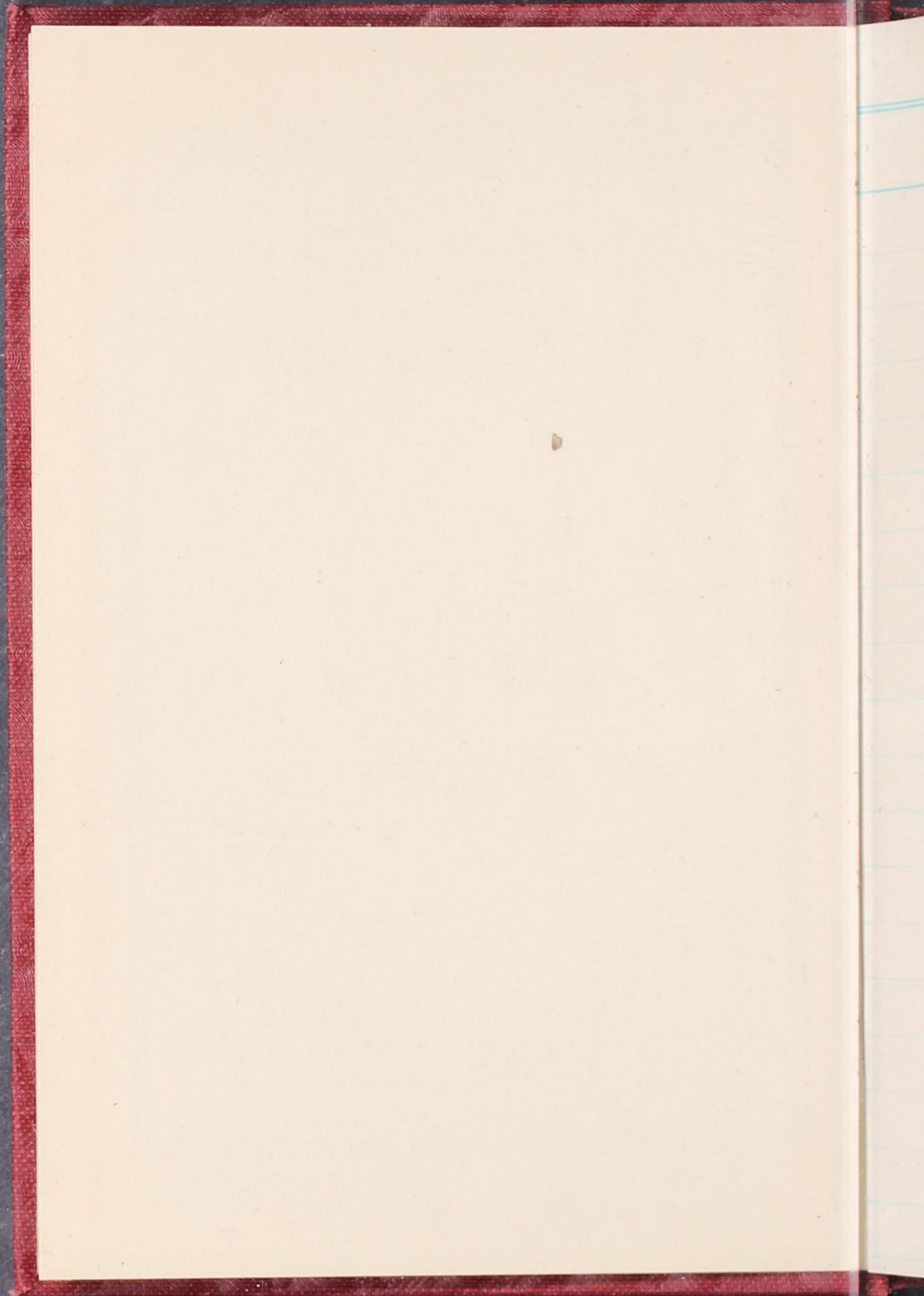

Monday, Feb. 15, 1932

Altho' I had intended to go to school early in order to go up to Lowell Hospital before Oriental, I did not leave until 7:30. It was for the better for I was awaited upon quickly. Much to my great sorrow, I cannot take swimming for awhile. It is a tough treat for me.

I could kill myself for not getting at least a "B" in Spanish. A "C" Heck! Hope to work up to a "B" yet. Gee I just have to. That is all!!!

Mr. Caldwell, becoming angered by someone's chattering, slammed his book, got up & left saying that he cannot stand someone's talking when he is. We walked out sized.

Basketball was lots of fun! I do enjoy the girls. They are lots of fun. Home again. The jamboree was fair.

Tuesday, Feb. 16, 1932

Somehow I managed to get over to Claire's in time this morning. Her father took us to school.

Altho' it was nice outside, I had to take rest gym because of my ringworms.

I studied until 5:30. Then I went to the W. A. A. supper at Mary David Readon's. Fortunately I met several of the girls on the st. car. It was lots of fun but people left early for they went to ~~hear~~ see Mary Wigman, dancer. — Yes — + I went some blocks before a st. car came. Had to wait somewhat for train.

Studied after I got home.

Wednesday, Feb. 17, 1932

I certainly made a bad showing in Oriental today. Could not even think, my mind was so dull.

Miss Parnon of Spanish is certainly queer. She locked the dr. to ask the class if they wanted to give Goldner a Valentine party Fri & give him a box of candy. So silly! In order to make her unlock the dr., we had to tell her we would at the end of the term. He asked her to leave the room. For well! Miss Scully could not get the ñ sound. Goldner said, "cañe, cañe, cañe hear me." So clear. It was most enjoyable in Spanish today.

I finished my Spanish before basket-ball - Helen Lilla chosen manager. We stayed until 8:45 at lib. The first time that I ever went without supper. It's enough when I got home. The serial ended - good. - Bed 12:15

Thursday, Feb. 18, 1932

Made an effort to get up when Nick called me but I couldn't do it. However, I got up in time for my light 10'clock but forgot my lunch. Was going to cut lecture to study for my test. Mid-term but finally went. I did, though, cut Spanish. I did fairly well I think & hope to get at least a "B" or I won't study any more. God he gave me a "satisfactory" on my map - not even a "good". I like to see a *vvv* - a pretty girl.

Grace came to school today. She's looking the same. Observed swimming today. God, it got me sore. Some of the girls swam the length today - 100' - 50' - 15'.

Being so tired, I came home at 4. I managed to translate my Spanish but did not do my English.

Oh, it was good to get to bed.

Friday, Feb. 19, 1932

In spite of my efforts to wake up early to read my English, I slept on 'til 7:00. However, I tried to do some on the train & st. car where I met with very little success. Likewise in Oriental I tried. Much to my great relief, Caldwell did not give us the promised quiz. Such was the brightened burden on my heart.

Fortunately I was not called on in Spanish. ~ ~ Gosh! forgot lunch on st. car.

I cleaned out my folder; did a little of this & that during the P. M. but getting very little done. After supper at Proctor's, we went over to Westminster where "The Tub" was practiced. Nois is very good! After the meeting, we read over our parts. I'm afraid that I am not good enough! See Hope practice will aid me. Missing my train provoked me immensely. Bed at 11:30.

Being quite "down & out", I slept until 12. What a lazy bum! Since son took pa took Shibuya san's son's funeral; Kan out in Hayward; & Nick in S.F. only Ern, Tok, Wark & I had lunch together.

Much to my great surprise, I collected enough energy to clean my room thoroughly. This I finished about 3; then a little stroll outside. Pa & son came home about this time. With renewed strength, I tackled my hist. which I also did until 11:30 (8:45 - 11:30) (3:45 - 6:00). The newspaper & dishes & talk took up the rest of the time.

Sunday, Feb. 21, 1932

Second Sunday in Lent

Got up in time to go to Sunday school but Ruth wasn't there. Read newspaper after.

I went to the cemetery & then we took a ride to Lake Merritt to airport & home altho' I did not intend to go. Did my Spanish before supper and ~~Eng~~ ^{Eng} after. Bed about 11:45.

However, I left my Eng. & washed my hair about 9:30. While I was getting it dried I tried to memorize my year. I hope I do well in it!

Monday, Feb. 22, 1932

Foggy.

Woke up about 7:20 to go to school to do my English. Got there about 9:30. Did it until 12 & then Anne & I went up to International House with Betty Anne Helm for lunch. Some kids took some snapshots & then back to study at 2:00 - 5:20; 6:00 - 9:30 Home. 11 - 12:45.

The English went on pretty well but does take a great deal of time.

Tuesday, Feb. 23, 1932

Went to hist. lecture as usual. Did my Spanish before lunch & read English before gym. Spent all the rest of my time writing my paper. Came home on st. car with Dorothy. She read my paper from after supper until 3:00 A.M. I wrote feverishly on my paper. Finally got it done & went to sleep 3:20.

Went to see Miss Marshal again & saw also Miss Coleman. It seems that we will actually be able to play this Friday for W. A. A.

Wednesday, Feb. 24, 1932

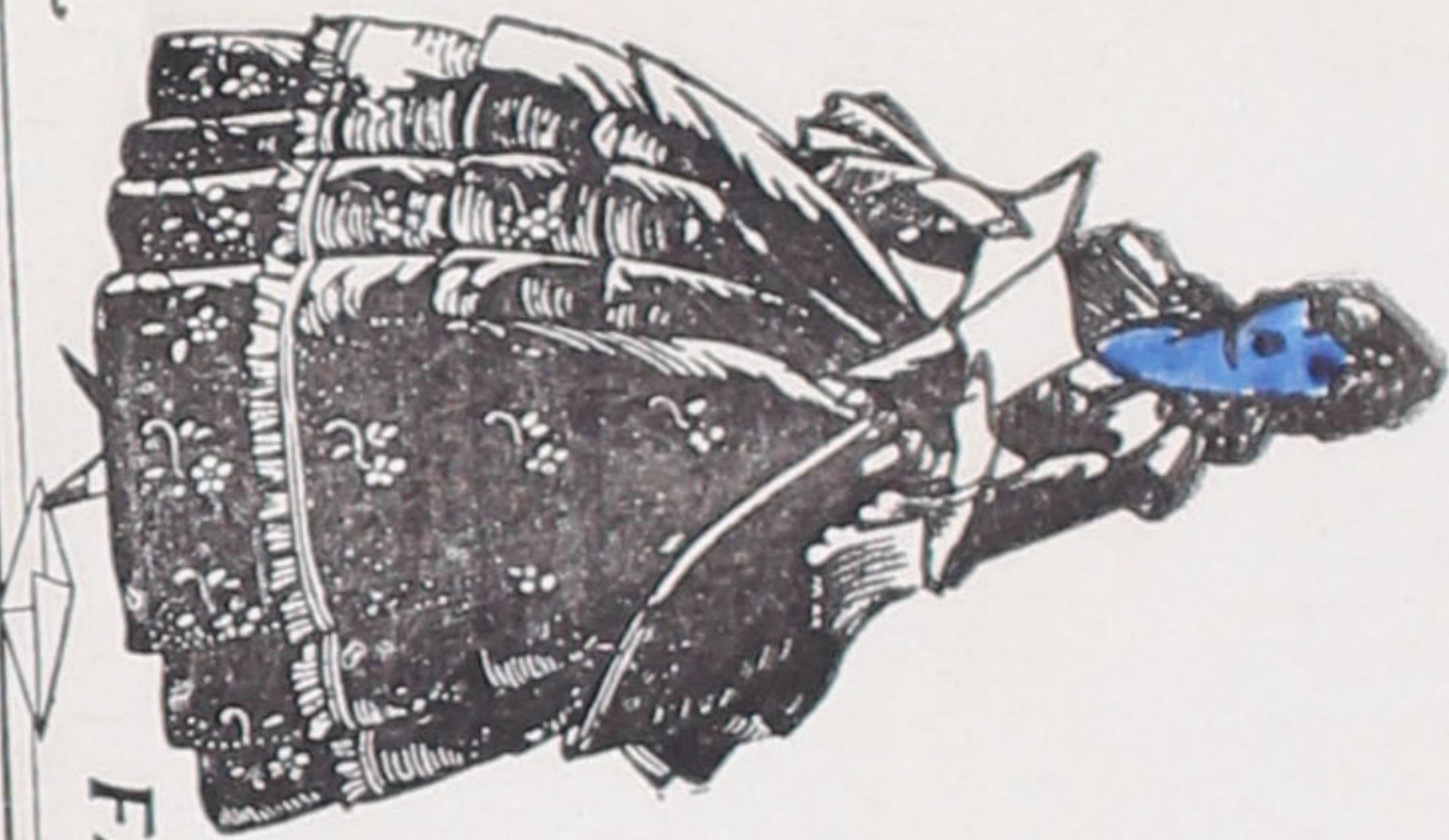

Friday, March 4, 1932

I cut Oriental this A.M. to read my English & then he asked a question on style which did not require the reading. Studied until 9:30 on esp. Spanish then went to play basketball J.W.S.C. Lots of fun. Miss Palmer grand.

Went up to the House to eat with Margaret & Helen. Embarrassed by bringing plate of salad. Went to Westminster to practice & meeting.

Book never got started till 9:30. So angered forgot part on first time - 2nd better finished 10:45. Nani waited for me. Ty didn't even give me a lift - so conspicuous the girls noticed: Mary, Sil, Bebe. Got home 12:00 tired. Gee if Ty were a little changed she'd be far.

Saturday, March 5, 1932

First time in a long time I got out of bed to clean up. Before noon. However, sat around in apt. - looked at patterns.

Tok having made up her mind to go to S.F. to hear a piano recital, & Han to S.F. with Nick, work & I went to game. Slight gloom first for Tok does not think of certain things.

The team hitched swell & we beat Washington 36-24 to win Pacific Coast champ. Won last nite 22-21. The ref. from north a Mexican off-track - & but terrible & walkings of Price a - missing.

Tok did go after all. Went to sleep pretty quiet.

Geo. Nijishi sent me another letter. Wished I knew his address.

Studied all aft. on Hist. → Basketball a lot of fun: Went to Tavern to eat with Nore then back to study.
Home 10:40.

Kaech is over now & so is babe that I did not see. Sleep after dispute in mama's bed in Lou's room.

Osku unexpectedly brought up Nore's not bringing me home. Mary Fujie too.

Wrote a week's diary - bed to sleep 12:30
