Eclipses

In the year 1935, there will be seven eclipses, five of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

1. January 5, a partial eclipse of the Sun, very small in magnitude. It will be visible in the south polar region.

2. January 19, a total eclipse of the Moon, visible in Europe, Asia, nearly all of Africa, and Australia. The duration of totality will be one hour and twenty-seven minutes.

3. February 3, a partial eclipse of the Sun, visible over most of North America. The magnitude of greatest eclipse will be 0.74.

4. June 30, a partial eclipse of the Sun, visible in Northern Europe, Northern Asia, and Greenland. The magnitude of greatest eclipse will be 0.34.

5. July 16, a total eclipse of the Moon, visible in nearly all of Africa, Southwestern Europe, and North and South America. The duration of totality will be one hour and forty minutes.

6. July 30, a partial eclipse of the Sun, visible in the south polar region. The magnitude of greatest eclipse will be 0.23.

7. December 25, an annular eclipse of the Sun, visible as a partial eclipse in the extreme southern part of South America. The annular Path passes over the south polar region.

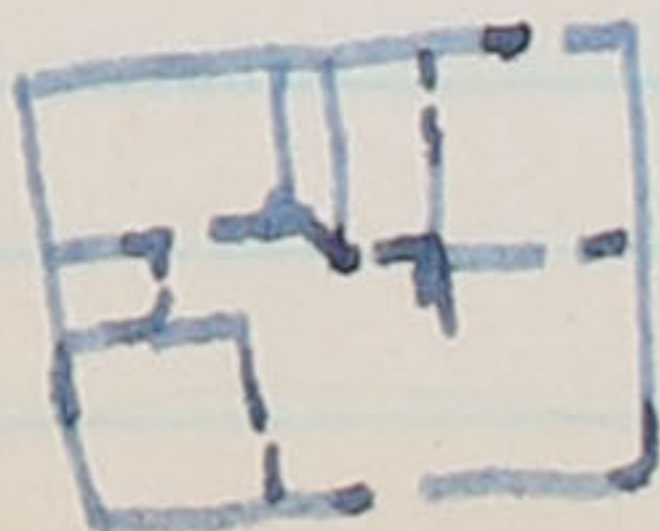
