Problem: Unemployment and illness.

Residence: United States 1907. Passport No. 89831 dated September 21, 1907, arriving in San Francisco on America Maru.

Claims continuous stay in County residence since 1931 or 1932.

When Mr. Kyogokn first came to the United States, he remained in California for approximately 7 years; lived in New York about 15 years; and then returned to California in about 1932.

Citizenship: No. Alien registration No. 3140818.

Employment: Ashby Laundry, Ashby Street, Berkeley, from 8-1941 to 11-1941, \$70.00 plus board.

New York Restaurant, 919 Broadway, Oakland, 1939 to 1941, about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, at \$20 per month plus board. Worked half day.

Nippon Laundry, 2034 Addison Street, Berkeley, 1932 to 1939, \$50.00 plus room and board.

While in New York he worked at the Hippodrome Theater as an actor the greater part of the time. He worked for 7 years prior to going to New York at the Nippon Laundry.

C.S.E.S. referral given to him. Mr. Kyogokn stated that he had lost his Social Security card.

Income: Last income was on 11-11-41 when he received \$40.00 from the Ashby Laundry. At present no income.

Economic & Financial Status: Claims no bank, insurance, or property. Bank and insurance forms signed.

Only debt was \$7.00 which he owes his landlord for rent of January, 1942.

Health: Mr. Kyogokn stated he has had a very bad cold since 11-1941. Due to ill health he was forced to stop working.

Relatives: No responsible relatives. Two sisters in Japan. Mrs. Seiko Kyogokn and Mrs. Fukuko, address 775 Nakano-Cho, Yamaguchi-Ken, Japan. His two sisters are widows.

Application for relief, residence statement No. 377, and employment form No. 2195 were given to Mr. Kyogokn to complete. It was suggested that he go to International Institute for help in completing the forms if he had no friend who could do the same for him.

Plan of Relief: Four-day meal ticket issued from 1-17-42 to 1-20-42 inclusive. Mr. Kyogokn is to return on 1-20-42 with completed forms.

Remarks: Applicant is a very small man about $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. tall. He feels that he will be able to work again as soon as he is given the proper medical treatment.

1-19-42 (Domoto) Office call. Mr. Kyogokn in office with completed forms. He stated that he had not gone to the C. S. E. S. as yet. He was advised ~~not~~ to do so immediately.

Rent: Applicant would like very much to change place of meal ticket to that of a Chinese restaurant. He was asked to get the name and address. He, however, is planning to discuss matter of use of kitchen with landlady. No 119 has been issued as yet as the rent has not been demanded.

Mr. Kyogokn will return on 1-21-42. Another meal ticket or a grocery order will then be necessary.

Health: Mr. Kyogokn was referred to the Oakland Clinic.
