#### Girl Reserve Committee:

The purpose of this group is to sponsor Girl Reserve activities, to be familiar with the Girl Reserve program, and to aid the staff and advisers with their problems, and to find and train leadership for Girl Reserve work.

#### Business Girls Committee:

The B & I Girls committee similar to the Girl Reserve committee works with the out of high school group and aids in their program by their interest, through counseling, and by supporting their activities.

#### Mothers group:

This group represents the mothers' interests in the Association through their children's groups as well as their own needs which the Association may be able to meet.

#### Young Matron's group:

This committee will be interested in the activities for the junior matrons and their needs and will sponsor whatever activities this group wishes to have.

#### Membership and Leadership

The Membership and Leadership committee will be responsible for recruiting new members and interpreting the YWCA to them, and will also be on the lookout for new leadership and encourage as well as sponsor leadership training.

#### Finance

The finance committee will be familiar with the financial set-up of the organization and be of aid whenever problems in finance arise such as finances for camps, conferences, Hospitality House, etc.

#### Resettlement

As resettlement is the primary objective of the WRA policy, this group will encourage study groups, forums, and discussions which will educate the members for relocation. This group will be interested in attitudes and needs for resettlement and will try to have all necessary information on resettlement for the members.

#### Counseling

A member of the Board will be available for counseling on personal problems and advice on vocations and other interests.

#### Building Management

This group will be responsible for interest in the Hospitality House and its activities, its needs, and its possibilities.

#### Public Relations

This group will be interested in the YWCA and its relation to the community and its needs. It will interpret the YWCA program to other groups and in turn keep the Board informed on the activities of the groups.
