Use of gen'l stereotype to justify evacuation

There was however - pressure

(a) military = (fear of invasion ^{after Pearl Harbor} - away from coast)

(b) economic = "under guise of patriotism & nationalism defense" wanted J. removed as could not compete as completely in farming (fear floral industry)

(c) social - cluster of living groups - (foster J. ideals - (gd every minority group has its little colony - Italian, Jewish, Mexican, Polish, etc.)

Antagonism there - was ~~traced~~ to fear

Lengthy of acts anti J. (Clay 142 add'l. p. 489)

p. 3- "displaced J. - a pamphlet

the women gracious + clean artistic

Farm 1941: hard-working (big farm + some hours) conscientious, quiet, law-abiding, more college-educated, responsible (taking care of own people) strong family ties.
 had-working skilled Capt. man (use of words, etc.) arg often racial group

what does a J. mean? all war-enemy thing sinister

To "dangerous, menacing" = (p. 19) "a Jap is a Jap." ^{Ben. De Witt}

(there was no evidence of sabotage or fifth-column activity since begin. of war - Attorney Gen. Warren said on Feb 21, 1942,

= hysteria or public pressure, engendered by anti-J. groups. (Gen. Leg. in assembled farmers in Calif)

campaigns foster hatred

J. soldiers = brave - patriotic

tendency generally to stereotype = racial groups.
