Dear Mr. Stafford:

This will reply to your letter dated February 19, 1943, with reference to the appointment of sponsors for the paroled aliens who are granted leave.

It is the responsibility of the Department of Justice to arrange for the appointment of a sponsor for each parolee who departs from a relocation center. Administrative Instruction No. 22, Revised, provides that the Director will obtain from the Department of Justice a specification of the terms and conditions that will apply to a parole during a contemplated leave. One of these terms and conditions will undoubtedly be that the parolee must report to a particular sponsor that will be named by the Department of Justice.

For your information, however, the Department of Justice has recently suggested a different procedure that will expedite the issuance of leave to pareless. That suggestion will be embodied in an Administrative Instruction in the near future. It will provide that the Project Director shall notify the District Director or the District Parole Officer of the Immigration and Naturalization Service nearest the relocation center of the issuance of a leave to a paroles. That Immigration Office in turn will communicate with the Immigration Office at the place of the future residence of the parolee and will arrange at that time for the supervision of the parolee at the place of his future residence.

I regret that considerable delay has attended reply to your inquiry, partly due to lack of personnel, and partly through a change in attitude of the Department of Justice.
