Tule Renunciants Restored U. S. Citizenship

SAN FRANCISCO - Approximately 4,200 Japanese Americans who renounced their citizenship in relocation camps during the war will have their American citizenship restored without any further delay, Federal Judge Louis E. Goodman ruled Tuesday.

Judge Goodman denied the Government's request for delay to present sample cases which, it was claimed, would show that most of the 4 200 were not loyal to the United States and therefore unfit for citizenship.
