A SENTIMENTAL JOURNEY TO CAMP SHELBY



You are cordially invited to attend a very special event planned for 1995 — the CAMP SHELBY HOMECOMING AND "GO FOR BROKE" MONUMENT DEDICA-TION, to be held in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, from June 15 through

June 18. The monument will salute the men of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, the 100th Infantry Battalion, S Company of the Military Intelligence Service, and the 171st Infantry Battalion.

Camp Shelby was the birthplace of the 442nd R.C.T., which included the 522nd Field Artillery Battalion and the 232nd Combat Engineers, and was the training ground for the 100th Battalion, S Co. M.I.S., and the 171st Battalion. Herb Sasaki of Hattiesburg has been working with Camp Shelby staff for over three years to have a monument erected and an exhibit placed in the Armed Forces Museum to tell the story of the unique quest of the Japanese-Americans during World War II to prove their loyalty to this country.

The U.S. Army, Camp Shelby and the City of Hattiesburg are all very proud of these units and are working together to honor the veterans who served in them, and to ensure that the Homecoming and Monument Dedication will be a very special and unforgettable occasion. Many federal, state, and local government officials, and many high ranking military personnel have already indicated their desire to attend and to be part of this tribute. Proposed speakers include President Clinton or Vice President Gore, Senator Inouye, General Shalikashvili and General Sullivan. In addition, many special events and ceremonies are planned: two Divisions of troops to honor the veterans, 1st Cav. Div. Special Horse Show commanded by Maj. Gen. Shinseki. Mississippi Air National Guard, "Confederate Air Force" WW II Airplane Show, 21 gun (rifle) salute and 21 gun (artillery) salute.

This is a Reunion that you will not want to miss! A detailed description of the Camp Shelby Itinerary beginning with arrival in New Orleans on June 15 is contained in this brochure.

THURSDAY, JUNE 15

Arrive New Orleans Airport and transfer to hotel. Meet and greet service and distribution of registration packets at hotel. Insofar as possible, all housing of attendees will be by service units or chapters to add to your enjoyment of this reunion. Enjoy nearby riverboat casino gaming during free time in New Orleans.

FRIDAY, JUNE 16

Motorcoaches depart in morning for Biloxi/ Gulfport area. Gaming stop and lunch at Grand Casino. Afternoon departure for Hattiesburg and hotel check-in. Evening transfer to Camp Shelby for dinner, welcome address by state and local officials, and entertainment.

SATURDAY, JUNE 17

Camp Shelby Homecoming and Monument Dedication activities today: early morning social time; Homecoming Ceremony with welcoming speeches by Maj. Gen. Garner and Col. Lyons, plus Mississippi Senators and Congressmen; Parade to Monument Site led by Miss. National Guard Band and Color Guard; Monument Dedication Ceremony with Fly Over and 21 Gun Rifle Salute, with addresses by Senator Daniel Inouye, General of the Army Sullivan, and Maj. Gen. Shinseki; lunch; and visits to 100th/442nd WW II display areas and

Armed Forces Museum. Proposed ceremonies by 31st Div. (Dixie) National Guard "Guardfest" Show; Maj. Gen. Shinseki, C.O. 1st Cav. Div., Fort Hood, Texas, Special Horse Show and armored tank show; and Confederate Air Force WW II Airplane Show.

Evening Homecoming Banquet at University of Southern Mississippi with dinner music provided by Miss. National Guard Special Group. Proposed main speakers: President Clinton or Vice President Gore, Sen. Daniel Inouye, and Chief of Staff General Shalikashvili.

SUNDAY, JUNE 18

Morning Memorial Services at Camp Shelby with the 442nd R.C.T. Chaplain from Los Angeles, 21 Artillery Gun Salute, and Miss. National Guard Camp Shelby Band. Return motorcoach transfer to New Orleans Airport for flights home, or depart on one of the Post-Dedication Tours.

NOTE: All attendees to the Camp Shelby Homecoming and Monument Dedication must register for the basic program described here through Corliss Tours.
