How's everything, Bill?

This camp is very unsettled right now — that is to say, the feelings of the people. It seems as if the war has come to our front doors to call the boys ~~on~~ this question of volunteering has led the people to quite a hysteria. Many are repatriating while most are straddling the fence.

They met here & everything
happened so suddenly. I feel
so happy for both of them for
I think that they'll get along
well.

Willie Hayakawa was here
a few weeks back. He seemed
quite given up & talked considerably
about Poston & his teaching there.

Guess I've told you he's waiting
to go back east. Billy Oshida
is attending a school in
Salt Lake City but doesn't
seem to like it much. They
make him work 5 hours a
day & so it's just as well
he stayed here, because

Eddie has volunteered & I guess
he must be quite definite in
his decision as to the matter of
this war. With you in the army
& Eddie going soon, let make
the family sometime think & work
of all kinds of things. I hope
you'll write Mama often. She's
quite worried & so is the rest of
the family. We hope you can
come visit us again soon.

Changing the subject,
I guess you'll be surprised
to hear that Izo Yamashita
is going to be married to
Orie Tamaki this coming Sunday.

He doesn't have much time
to study.

Bill, what about you?
We're so anxious to know
what you are doing &
wondering when you'll be
transferred again. Right now,
that's all that matters to us.
