My darling Billy,

I finally have the photos and I am hurrying to send them to you. I added the little photos to my letter and I will send you my costume photo separately because it is too big to fit in my letter. How do you like them and do they please you Billy darling? I hope so. I think that, here, in a couple of days, we will be able to take some others because I have a new film roll, a rare thing in Nice.⁵⁸ Today Billy darling, I find the time to be even longer than ever and I wish even more than normal to have you next to me. How the days are long without you Billy darling. Why don't I have the pleasure of having you next to me? But alas, I will still have to wait many days probably before seeing you again. Awaiting the beautiful day where I will see you again Billy darling, I can only send you all my love and millions of kisses.

⁵⁸During the war, different combat operators were given the job of recording as much as they could on film rolls meaning that there were many photos taken of the 442nd during their training, deployment and eventually fighting on the front lines. The Army evidently developed an Army Pictorial Service tasked with documenting the war and its atrocities or successes. It was already difficult for Army cameramen to secure unused and proper film and therefore it proved even more difficult for civilians to secure film as well.
