Tonight I will only give you a couple words because we spent the day at Cap-d'Ail near Monaco and we spent most of the time in the water.⁷⁸ Also, like everyone else, I am very tired this evening. But Jany must have told you in detail all about our day. We definitely thought about you and we regretted that you were not among us. Since your departure, the weather has improved and the sea is very calm. This allows Jany to make a lot of progres in her swimming. As of now she swims alone but is not yet venturing into the open waters. She is already taking long swims. But I think that tonight you have gone back to the edges of Lake Como and found all of your friends.⁷⁹ They will help you tolerate your exile. I suppose that you will restart your swims and when you come back to us, you will be so dark that we would take you for a "Negro."⁸⁰ My skin is also becoming more and more tan. Today, July 4th, it's Independance Day and in Nice, this day is commemorated like it should be. But alas, we are all too tired to attend the fireworks, the races and the basketball games.⁸¹ But I leave you my dear Billy in telling you goodnight and good luck.
