Elaine slept in the bassinette until December 8, 1941. Moved into the crib that daddy fixed and slept very well!

Sat on the toilet for <sup>the</sup> first time January 21 - ~~Wed~~ good results but not regular so ~~continued~~ <sup>continued</sup> ~~con.~~ <sup>times.</sup>

When left out stomach she has learn to turn over so now have to put up the bars 2-23-42

First of February Elaine started to sit on the toilet had good results. - 42

On February 22<sup>nd</sup> Elaine took her first long trip to the country to visit grandfather and Uncle Gose. Returned the following evening.

March 13, 1942 Elaine had her first "snuffles".

March 16, 1942 Elaine had a bad cold doctor's her with 5 drops syrup of Ephedrine in teaspoon of water every 4 hours. Also rubbed warm camphorated oil.

March 13. Friday Elaine fell off daddy's bed.

" 15 Sunday Elaine fell off aunt Sam's bed.

March 17th St Patrick's day first sign of ~~teeth~~ discovered by mother.
