A Message from the People of California

DEAR YOUNG CITIZEN:

Today when you receive this diploma of graduation, I want you to imagine that a hand is reaching out to you from the State Capitol at Sacramento, to clasp your own and wish you well; imagine also a voice, sincere and earnest,—the voice of the people of California, saying to you in this moment of joy—“Well done, proud young citizen. You deserve our praise and congratulation and gladly do we give them. Go forth upon the next lap of your journey, carrying with you this diploma as evidence that you have reached the first milestone on the road to success. And may your heart pulse strong with hope throughout your journey to the land which the poet calls the ‘Land of the Heart’s Desire.’”

Success—what a wonderful word it is! It represents what all men and women have toiled and striven for since the beginning. And you are no exception,—you also are working to attain success. And so I would say a word to you concerning the future. The words on this diploma do not mean that you are educated.
