Prior to the last war, Japanese Daily Papers, published in this country, were intercepting news which the Japanese News Agencies "Rengo", "Dentsu" and later "Domei", were transmitting, by short wave radio. Since they were using Morse Code, copies were all in Romanized Japanese.

- 2. I translated news from A.P., U.P., I.N.S. and local newspapers into Japanese.
- 3. I wrote news analysis', news comments, and editorial reveiws.
- 4. Reproduced news and feature stories from Japanese newspapers and Magazines.
- 5. Put headings on copies insert cuts (illustrations), and lay-out the copies.
- 6. Read all proofs.
- 7. Occasionally interviewed prominent Japanese.

From 1936 to 1941, I worked part-time, teaching, at a Japanese language School. I Earned #35.00 Per. Month.
