Santa Fe, April 22, 1943.

Dear Tamako: Moved again. This place, Santa Fe,
the capital of N.M., and a city of 20,000 people lies upon
the southern edge of the Rocky with an elevation close to
8,000 feet ~~above~~ the sea level. The weather is fine and
pleasant. But find hard to breath once in a while because
of the elevation. The camps are built on the hill side just
opposite to the city. Air is very clear and water is also
good. The ~~the~~ plateau expands almost endless
while the Rocky ramifies ~~to~~ high and low on the surface.
View is quite picturesque. But I guess I came too close
to the heaven. ~~At~~ A step higher, I will be living right in
the heaven.
