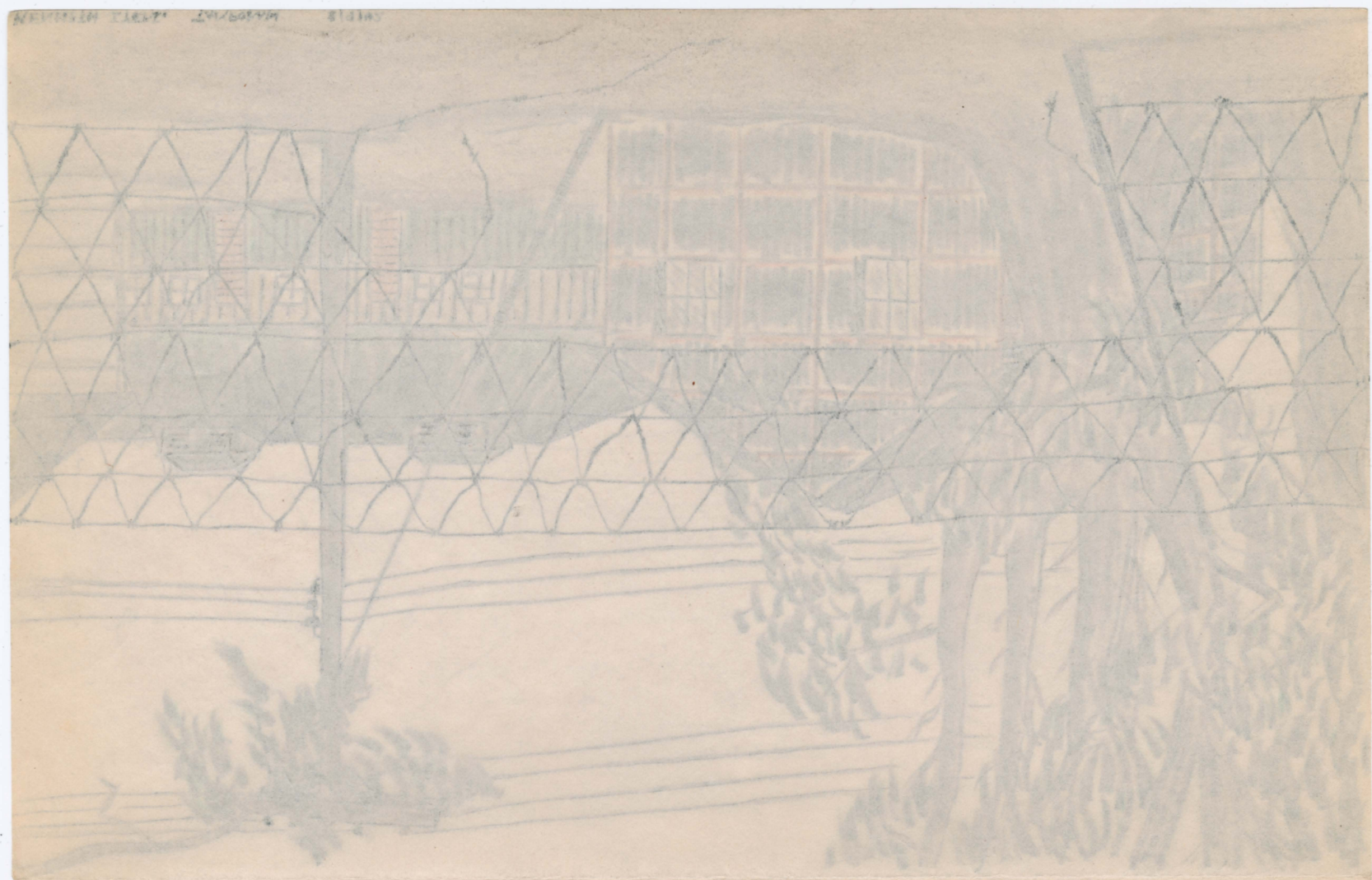




KENNETH IYEKI. TAMFORAN 8/9/42



This is a scene on the South side of Camp. The Eucalyptus trees were always green, a factor which helped to keep our morale up. The green houses in the background were the "better" stables, on the opposite side of the track from the "common" plank horse shelter. Those that were assigned to live in these green stables promptly tacked up signs above their doors such as "Come Inn", "Hotel St. Francis", "The Works" etc. The building in the foreground is a latrine building. The children would have climbed the trees but were afraid of getting shot at by the guards close by. One could easily have followed a great limb out over and beyond the fence.
