Working here I am again and I hope that you don't mind my dear. Writing letters of interest and so forth are out of my line. Gee I sure wished that I could write wonderful letters like you my love.

Dearest I sure do wish that I could be besides you and hold you in my arms but all I can do is just think about it my love. I am praying that that day would come soon. I love and miss you and think with all my heart and you both mean everything to me. How I'll be coming home some day and when I do how you had better watch yourself. How when I do come home I'll come so fast that I won't have time to let you know. Please don't have any high hopes that I'll be home real soon but if every-

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thing goes alright I may be home sooner than I think. How please promise me that you won't have any high hopes but pray that I'll be home soon.

Dearest forget about my uniforms but please try and get me a pair of shoes. The size should be 6 D. color brown and besides a nice pair of civilian shoes ought to feel plenty good.

See how the cigarette situation here is terrible. All of us in our room have been out since a couple of days ago. Wish you are able to get me more but it is just one of those things. Thank you ever so much for getting them my dear.

Hardly hope that Trudy is there by now and if she is will you please give her my best regards. The same for Edward. Trudy is sure lucky that Ed isn't in the Army cause it really is a tough life out here.

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Darling I still would like to know how much you have saved thus far. I know it isn't much but I sure would like to know or don't you trust me. To be real truthful I haven't saved a darn cent myself except that I've still got a few dollars in my pocket as yet. All I can say is that it cost ten times more for things around here than in the U. S. A. As far as P. X. and newspapers in camp are concern they are very reasonable but our P. X. things are rationed and we are limited to what we can get. All I can say is that things are tough all over.

Well my platoon is getting ~~so~~ smaller day by day and that makes me ~~very~~ happy. Many of the boys ~~has~~ already gone home but they deserve to go home cause they had over thirty months overseas and have seen a lot of combat time.
