You're really a beautiful woman how and I don't mean maybe. Darling I hope that I will be home soon and please don't listen to any rumors or read about them.

I'll let you know if any-
thing new comes up. We
always have plenty of
rumors around here
and I hardly listen to
them. If I did I really
would go nuts. Now I
only hope that when I
get back to the States
that they will let me
out of the Army. Now
like I have said before
that when I come home
I am not going to do a
damn thing for awhile
except to look at you
and admire you my dear.
Now if we can afford it
we may go on a honeymoon
which we never did have.
See how I should of thought
a lot more of these things
way before this and at
times I could shoot myself
for it. Well any how

I pray that I can make you both real happy one of these days.

Well how I haven't found anything to wrap your stockings with so you'll have to wait a day or two more. If I can't find a box then I'll just wrap it up in some paper and send it to you dear.

How in this letter I am going to enclose fifty dollars. I hope that it will get to you okay how. Another fella is going have a twenty five dollar money order made out to you for me and soon as I get it I will mail it to you also. How I am sorry that they don't allow us to send any more

then our pay cause I
wanted to ^{send} you all of it
at the same time. De
hon I pray that we can
save enough so that we
can have another child
as soon as I come home.

I have my fingers crossed
hon and hope that you
will get her wish one
of these days soon.

De hon this guard
duty sure does get tiresome
day after day. It isn't
any hard work at all
except that it is dull
and tiresome. If we do
get a little time off once
in awhile it wouldn't

can't last forever and
some day they will send us home.
