My dear Henri;-

I am very ^{sorry} that I ~~did~~ have not written to you for a long time. How are you getting along? Helen told us that you are working hard and very kind to her. I am very glad to say that I am getting well, and my feeling is pretty well. The church raised my salary a bit - ten Yen each month from last month-. So it is just good enough for us to enjoy our life here at Moji. As you know I get 25 Yen from the Mitusi Company each month and I get another one from Mr. Minoura (20) teaching English once a week at his home (for his boys) and from Miss. Inouye's. In Japan there are not so many Christian ministers who receive such a good income I believe. I always KANSHA and do my best in every way as minister.

Early in October, I spent four days at Takayashiki with ~~all~~ folks. There was a good talk about you. They say they had a wonderful time with you when you called on them last year. During my stay at Sendai, I met the president of the Miyagi College and its dean and asked about Julia. Because I am planning to send her to the Music department from next spring when she completed her High School ^{work} at Kokura. The president was one of my DOSOSEI of the University of Chicago and invited his friends and had tea party at his home. I think Julia will be ~~received~~ (enrolled) next spring to the college.

I had a good trip to Nagasaki last week. I was called to speak to the special meetings which was held at the Congregational church -15th-17th, inst-. I visited many historical Catholic churches in the city, and ^{had a} good time at Unzen with my friend a day on my way home.

Did you hear about the Christian Conference of all over Japan which was held at Aoyama Gakuin yard on October 17⁹ It was the largest audience I ever saw in this country. It was counted about twenty thousand people in the morning service. I am very glad to say that all the denominations in this country are to united within next spring. Accordingly missionaries from different lands are going their homes in the near future. But teachers who are connected to the educational institutions in Japan will not discontonue right away.

Helen says that Misaki is in Japan now, but we do not see her yet. Perhaps she will not come to the Kyushu. Mrs. Watanabe is anxious about the shoes for Takehiko, so you had better find some one who come back Japan to ask him to bring them.

It is still warm yet here at Moji, I think more warner than this time last year. We have no stove yet. Every thing good with us now and waiting for your letter.
