My Dear Tomoe-san:


We received your kindfull gifts to our family which were sent from Mr. Ozawa Hisamitsu in Tokyo with hearty thanks.

As you understand well, in Japan it is very hard to get any pure cotton goods, medicine, steel wares, sugar, matches, and etc., which we spent carelessly before the Japan-China fighting. Stable Fibire goods now prevail in stead of cotton goods, which are very weak against water.

We must save water in this Summer as no rain in this rainy season, save coal and charcoal as no transportation and labourers, save hood as we must send them to China and also must save any necessary goods for lives as we must send to China.
