

June 27, 1945

Dear Henri:

I received the letters you forwarded this morning. I have a break between classes this morning, so until then I can't write to you. Teachers' meeting ~~tomorrow~~ this morning. I had to teach at 8:00 a.m. and finished at 8:50 a.m. I don't have to teach until 1:15 p.m. now, and will finish at 2:05 p.m.

Well, so far it has been rather nice teaching the officers. There are quite a few Wac officers here. Some of them are nice but some have an awful sour disposition. Most of them are quite eager now since it is easy this first week. Most of the officers this time are rather young. So some are the eager beaver type.

Saturday, I will be teaching until 3:05 p.m. so that means, I will be home ~~around~~ ^{between} 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. It depends on what train I can take. I don't have the schedule here but know that I will be late on account of the transportation in S.F. on Saturday evenings. So please get some groceries like: milk, lettuce, tomatoes (1 pound), vegetable either zucchini, string beans if they have any or asparagus. Try and buy at least 2 kinds of vegetable. One kind for Saturday night and the other for Sunday dinner. Fruit if you want something in the house, bread if you think we need some. I think I have some butter in the drawer. I hope you will be able to bring home some pepper and celery.

Did Miss Lancaster and her mother arrive?

I guess that's about all for now. I can't think of anything now. Will write again when I get home. I'm in the instructor's room and can't think too well with the others in here.
