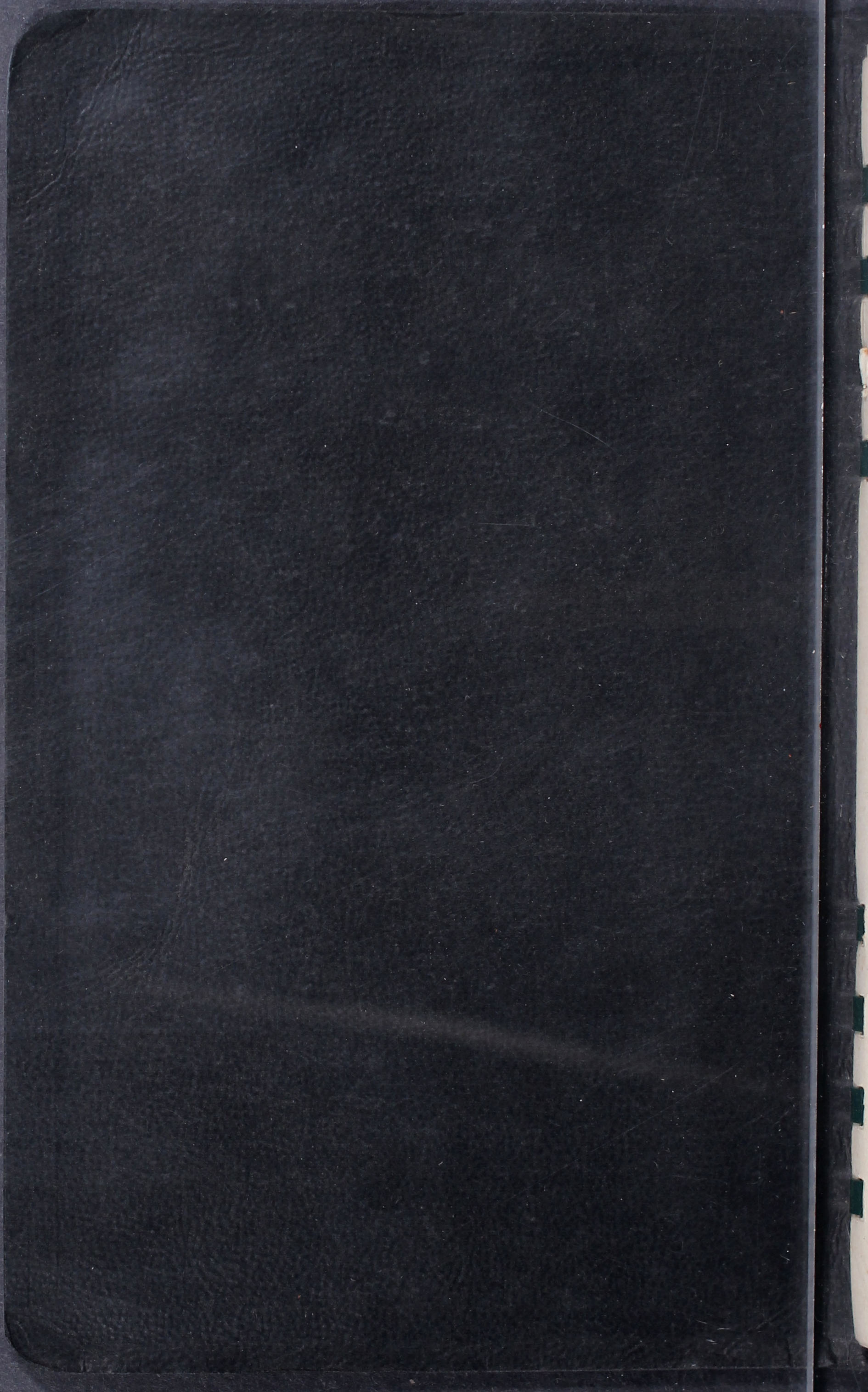


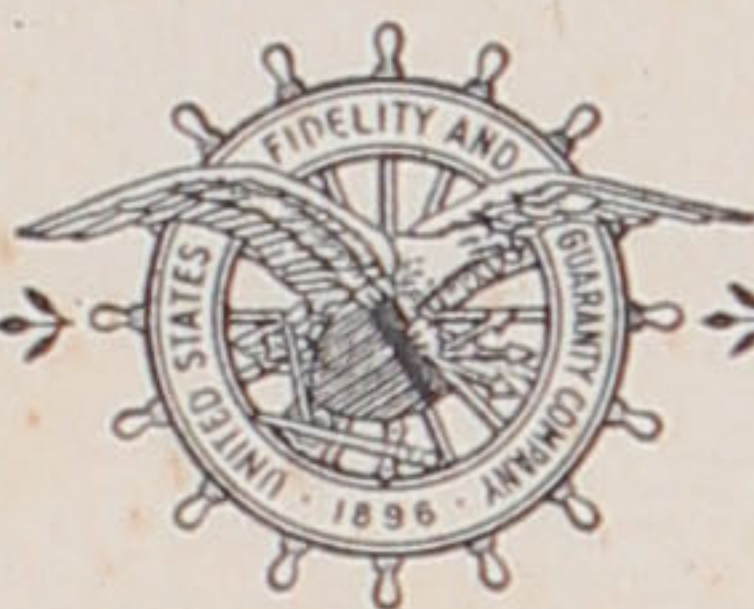

Mike Masaroka Nat'l Exec. Secy of IAC from Salt Lake City gave a talk to the camp at D-32 — 2:30 — 5:30 impressive. Should have won over the doubtful to the side of IAC and made staunch supporters. Penetrating speaker.

PM had session for about 100 — again, 1000 <sup>in</sup> afternoon.

feels like dissension among the ranks - Heidi has been hounding Kenji to let her be his typist and even Eiko Honda wants to be at the mines graph as a technician instead of reporter. Well, tomorrow we have a disagreement - we'll see.

Went to Issei's meeting at Oct 32 - disorderly at best but I think people starving themselves. Ought to have more of them. Tonight's was to choose problems to present to Spanish Vice Council Capt. A. Martin for SF to take up thru ambassador to USA



TUESDAY, JANUARY 19

Had staff meeting - Parkson ~~present and gave~~ gave talk - said we were to have larger quarters soon. Jaro, managing editor, who said there was shortage of reporters as only 3 - if Keyo, Shiimoto, Norman, & Eiko are reporters, I probably, as last week's staff names ran in the Pat. Times, considered women's editor. If so, I am only getting reporter's pay & doing editor's work which is strange - something funny somewhere! And I got Mizo her job, originally, by approaching her & then presenting her to Hull, also recommending her highly - of course she has been efficient - too much so - so that now she has the power to keep me down. I've hit on an idea tonight as I lay sleepless - & have finally decided to approach Lafabrique offering services to elderly

Fine silt sifting thru room altho we have our windows weather stripped. Didn't go to work - the dust so bad, couldn't see 3 ft past window, let alone across the way to Papa's house.

Last night Utah the cat caught her 5<sup>th</sup> rodent.

2:30 AM this time a mouse - the 3<sup>rd</sup> since last Thurs. night.

2 gophers & 3 mice now - Thurs, Sun, last night.

Let Martha take brown fortnighter I had for long time - since 1933. Getting ready to go to school. Leaves in 10 days or so - tomorrow going as block chopper to Delta.

Henri reading "Sociology" text book for Smith college dictated by 2 girls. Also book on public speaking he got last night.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 22

Drept storm continuing. Was told Millard County Chronicle quoted my column from last week's page.

But told ~~Henri~~ Block mgr to be official announcer in D.H. family objected. Block meeting wanted me. Had mine graph stencils cut - two pages for giraffe pattern - with sewing directions. Came out really nice.

This week passed so swiftly. Tonight had my block meeting. I took the stand that it was much more proper & prudent now to register & show willingness to cooperate as citizens should, expressing loyalty & willingness to bear arms in its defense if we so felt, & by so registering preserve for us the right to fight for our civil liberties now taken away. At a 2nd session in the Block Mgr's office I restated & said in addition we had nothing to lose, everything to gain by cooperation. How we answer is an individual problem. The act of registering & doing as bid (compulsory by War Dept anyway) is against refusing registration, which by the way is req. for Selective Service for men citizens, is like having a pass to enter an institution & retaining the right to keep the pass by so saying, even if we cannot enter inst. & enjoy its privileges - instead of throwing it away. It is better to have the pass with the

hopes we may use it someday to get in & enjoy privileges again - Rather than ticket or pass, maybe better to say membership card to club. Anyway, those left in the street after throwing away pass or ticket will be kiberi & nisei stranded in the street, tho' nisei have godfather to take them in like the Salvation Army does the destitute of the streets in form of Japan. Vote taken showed 46 for holding back reg. until citizenship status & civil rights clarified, 22 for reg. first & demanding rights & privileges concurrently or later. I went with Harri to reg today already anyway, tho' our block agreed unanimously to take a united stand. I told the nisei & kiberi alike tonight that I have no county in the world to go to or care for at America. I wanted say this to all. That's why I refused nomination to chairmanship tonight.
