Dear Takeko,

I guess its about time I wrote again. At the present I'm spending my time at the Regimental Rest camp here in San Pellegrino a little resort town in the Italian alps. We really have a nice deal here, my only regret is that it won't last too long. Plenty of things to do around here such as fishing, bicycling, swimming etc. The only thing I'm interested in now is sleeping on a nice comfortable bed which I haven't had the chance to do for the past two months. About three or four days.

ago some of us went up
into Austria escorting some
German prisoners that went up
to haul some materials. It
took us three days to go up
and return. The Austrians seem
to be cleaner people than the
Italians, but they seem to be
no German than anything else.
As soon as I got back from
the trip to Austria I got a
one day pass to Milan the
second largest city in Italia.
Milan hasn't been affected by
the war too much and a
person can get just about
anything. The fruits, in fact
some things you can't even
get in the States.

I understand Hachi has
come overseas, but I haven't
seen him as yet. I'll write
more later.
