Letter #10 April 12, 1958 Saturday

Dear Henri:

Enclosed are some reports I had Dorothy write up for you. Thought you took the sales record for wholesale with you (shipping) but she found it in her desk. I looked everywhere and couldn't find it. Well, looks like April will be pretty sad. Later I will have Dorothy do the shipments in territories. Jan hasn't been writing many orders lately so it should show up. Well, business is slow, but hope it will pick up. The retail does show an upturn, in spite of the bad weather. Now that we are having summer weather suddenly, it should be much better. The Mall Hall convention Hall at the civic center was just opened yesterday and the Chemists convention will use it next week. Let's hope that this means more conventions and more tourists to increase the retail business.

Weather in other parts of the country should begin to improve and perhaps people will leave their houses to buy. I read in the papers that the biggest problem now is to try and induce the public to BUY. Too many people are saving their money now. Eisenhower also is urging the people to go out and buy. Well, we hope they buy our stuff.

Yesterday we sent out some brochures and again will send some Monday. As we already have the labels typed up, it won't be so hard. I think we should have an addressing machine and wee if we could conceivably use that one you have.

Eiichi is cutting off the wholesale prices and using the brochure for umbrellas for some retail too. The mail orders as a result is coming in steadily though not in over-whelming numbers. At least during these dull days, it's not putting a strain on the boys.

Re: Bamboo hot pad, the general opinion is that it is too high priced at \$4.50/dz. Wish it could be 3.00 anyway. It really isn't worth 75¢, so they say. Of course we should price others and see, but we feel if the beans are larger, it would look better and will seem to look like it's worth more, somehow. There's room for improvement in the design.

Just got the mail, and we got almost \$1300.- today, thank goodness. The orders weren't many, however. Hopenthe brochure will do some good.

Did Jim tell you that the shipping cartons for the ZLMX are too weak and Joe says most of them are split or broken. They can't use the same ones for the wooden mats as the grass mats because they are so much heavier. Or else they should use smaller boxes or

Have to do the estate income tax, stae and federal as well as my own today so will be very busy. Only have until Tuesday, you know.
