SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT FOR ALIENS SEEKING TEMPORARY ADMISSION TO THE UNITED STATES

A person who desires to assume the financial sponsorship of an alien seeking admission to the United States as nonimmigrants may supply an affidavit in duplicate setting forth the sponsor's financial ability and willingness to contribute to the alien's support. Both copies must be sworn to before a Notary Public in the United States or before an American consular officer abroad. There is no prescribed form for such affidavits and the following example is merely for the information and convenience of sponsors.

The purpose of a sponsor's affidavit of support is merely to guarantee that the alien will have sufficient funds at his disposal while in the United States to cover his expenses and thus prevent him from becoming a public charge.

The sponsor's affidavit of support has no bearing whatsoever on the consular officer's determination of a nonimmigrant alien's intent to depart from the United States upon the termination of his authorized period of stay. The burden of proof rests solely on the nonimmigrant alien to establish to the satisfaction of the visa issuing officer that he is truly proceeding to the United States for a temporary purpose, and that he has a residence abroad which he has no intention of abandoning.

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To substantiate the information regarding income and resources the sponsor may attach to his affidavit a certified copy or notarized copy of his latest income tax return; a statement from an employer showing the employee's salary and the length and permanency of employment; a statement from an officer of a bank regarding the sponsor's account, showing the date the account was sponed and the present balance; or other evidence adequate to establish the financial ability of the sponsor to carry out his financial undertaking toward the beneficiary.
