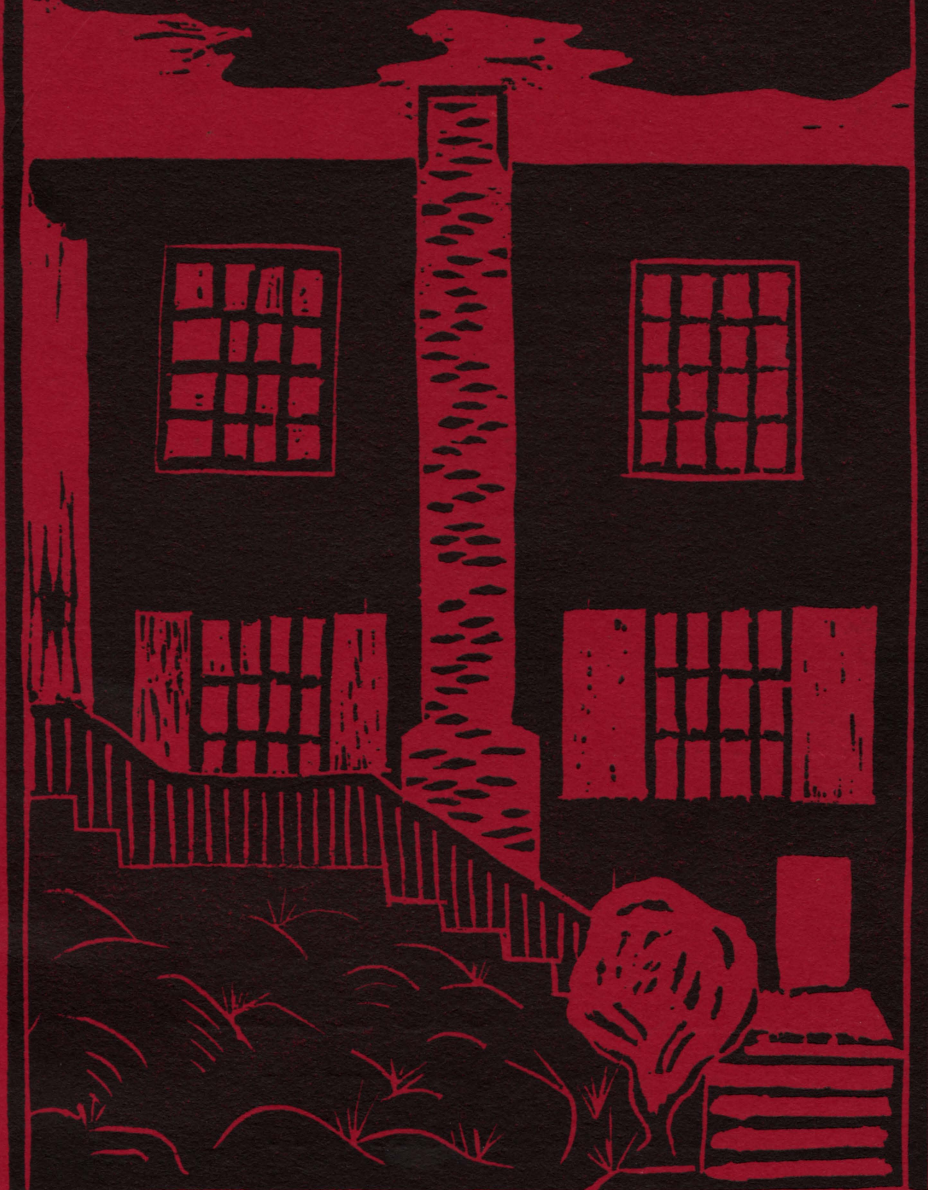

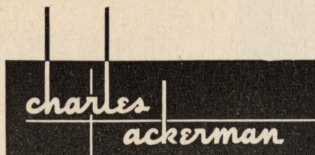

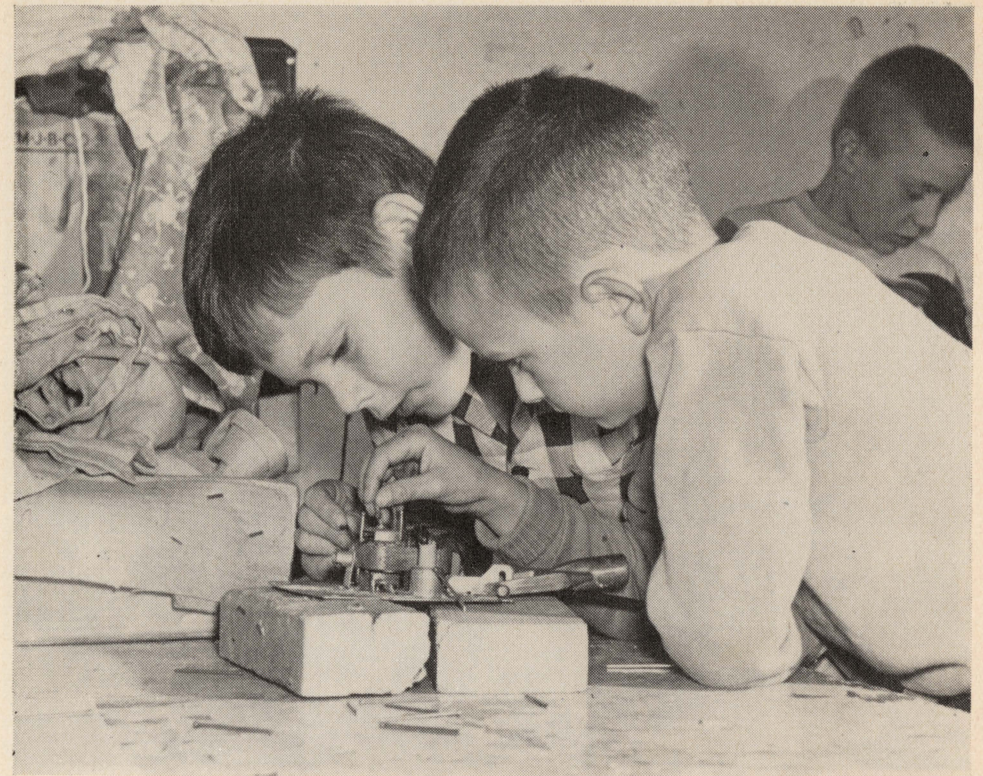

PRESIDIO HILL SCHOOL

Where: Parents, like those who founded the school 32 years ago, cooperate to provide a favorable environment for the education of their children.

Where: Children of all races and creeds from kindergarten through 6th grade

Learn to

Read, Write, Spell, Use Numbers . . . in a manner appropriate to each child's Age, Maturity, Ability, Experience.

They find the 3 R's exciting skills to develop. They take pride in using these "tools" in expressing their own ideas, understanding ideas of others, and in working out the solutions to the many real problems of their daily school life.

LIVE TOGETHER . . . in class groups of 15 to 20 children of comparable age and social maturity.



These kindergarten youngsters are exploring the mysteries of the printed word. They will be reading and writing next year.

STUDY . . . materials selected for each individual's ability, need and interest.

PLAN . . . with one another and with the staff, individual learning experiences, class activities and whole school functions.

EVALUATE . . . themselves and their work in relation to the goals and standards they help in setting for themselves.

EXPLORE . . . their expanding environment, both natural and social. Direct experience is emphasized, supplemented by wide reading, audio visual materials, and consultation with informed visitors.

INTEGRATE . . . their learning and their experience through painting and drawing, dramatic presentations, group discussion, music and shop.

PLAY . . . on the playground and in the park. Time is provided for free or self-directed play and for instruction in organized sports and games.

ENJOY AND APPRECIATE . . . music. They participate naturally in folk song and dance, and in special music classes which develop a rich understanding of choral and instrumental music.

USE . . . paints, clay, tools and other materials to portray their own impressions and feelings, or to make some object they need or want. Each group has an art and shop class with a special teacher at least once a week.

Are Taught by

experienced, skilled teachers who believe that . . .

Children must be respected and respect themselves in order to show respect for others.



Plenty of strenuous outdoor exercise makes for good health, happier children and better learning

A good foundation in the skill subjects is vital.

Creative expression is an integral part of the child's experience.

Only skillfully guided experiences and opportunities to make choices can develop in children those essential qualities of initiative, leadership and cooperation.

Mutual help, friendship, and responsibility among teachers, pupils and parents is the basis of good teaching and effective learning.

The Program by Groups

FIVES . . . are adjusting to school, learning about pets, firemen, trains, weather, machines, etc. Materials and experiences are selected to stimulate and develop interest in learning and provide a basis for reading instruction.

SIXES . . . widen their interest to the immediate community. They learn about transportation, communication, stores, farms, animals, growing things. As they show readiness they begin to read, write and work with numbers.

SEVENS . . . are interested in the how, where and why of the world about them and attempt to answer their questions through experiments in the classroom and trips to near by parks. A study of a more simple culture, such as that of the American Indian, forms a basis for a better understanding of our present day community.

EIGHTS and NINES . . . undertake a more intensive study of California and America's place in the world of nations. Individual and group research into the lives and customs of a neighboring country and a European nation provide for full use of this group's increasing curiosity and independent study skills.

Painting and drawing help understand better the many things six year olds see and learn about. Their own ideas are important and they enjoy sharing them with one another as they work.

TENS and ELEVENS . . . embrace a wider area of learning. A study of our heritage from ancient civilizations such as Egypt and Greece, helps children understand how simpler societies function. The study of our own and other modern nations, and of industrial units such as basic raw materials, food, transportation, communication, help the children understand their own place in the community, state, nation and world.

Art and Music

are developed throughout the program as main avenues to creative expression and personal satisfaction. Special teachers meet with each group for art and music experiences in addition to those provided in the regular classroom program.

MUSIC CLASSES for the eights to elevens comprise training in harmony, theory, chord formation, rhythmic, singing and study of the works of the great composers from Bach to those of the present day. Classes meet three times weekly.

Science

for each of the groups is taught by each of the teachers wherever it helps children explain or understand what they are doing, and through experiments, demonstrations and science units.

Shop Classes

are taught by a special teacher who meets with each group for one period a week.

for children seven and older is planned for a full week in the Spring. Younger children take day trips.

Visitors

Many important characteristics of the school and particularly the enthusiasm of the children cannot be described in writing. Interested people are urged to visit often.

Scholarships

In order to insure the operation of democratic processes and the development of democratic attitudes, besides bringing the advantages of a modern, private school within the reach of families from varying economic levels, three types of scholarship aid are offered by Presidio Hill School.

There is the outright scholarship grant, the amount of which is dependent on the family's ability to pay. There is the earned tuition scholarship, which offers parents an opportunity to earn a portion of the fees through contributing necessary work to the school, such as cooking, gardening, library work, painting and repairs. And also offered by the school to families with limited present income, but with a future earning potential, is a non-interest bearing loan to apply toward tuition.

These loans, grants and earned tuition scholarships are available to parents of current students and to families considering registration of their children in Presidio Hill School. Further information may be obtained from the school office.

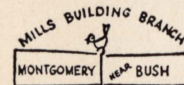

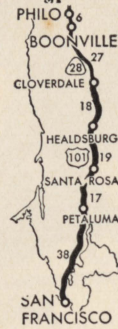

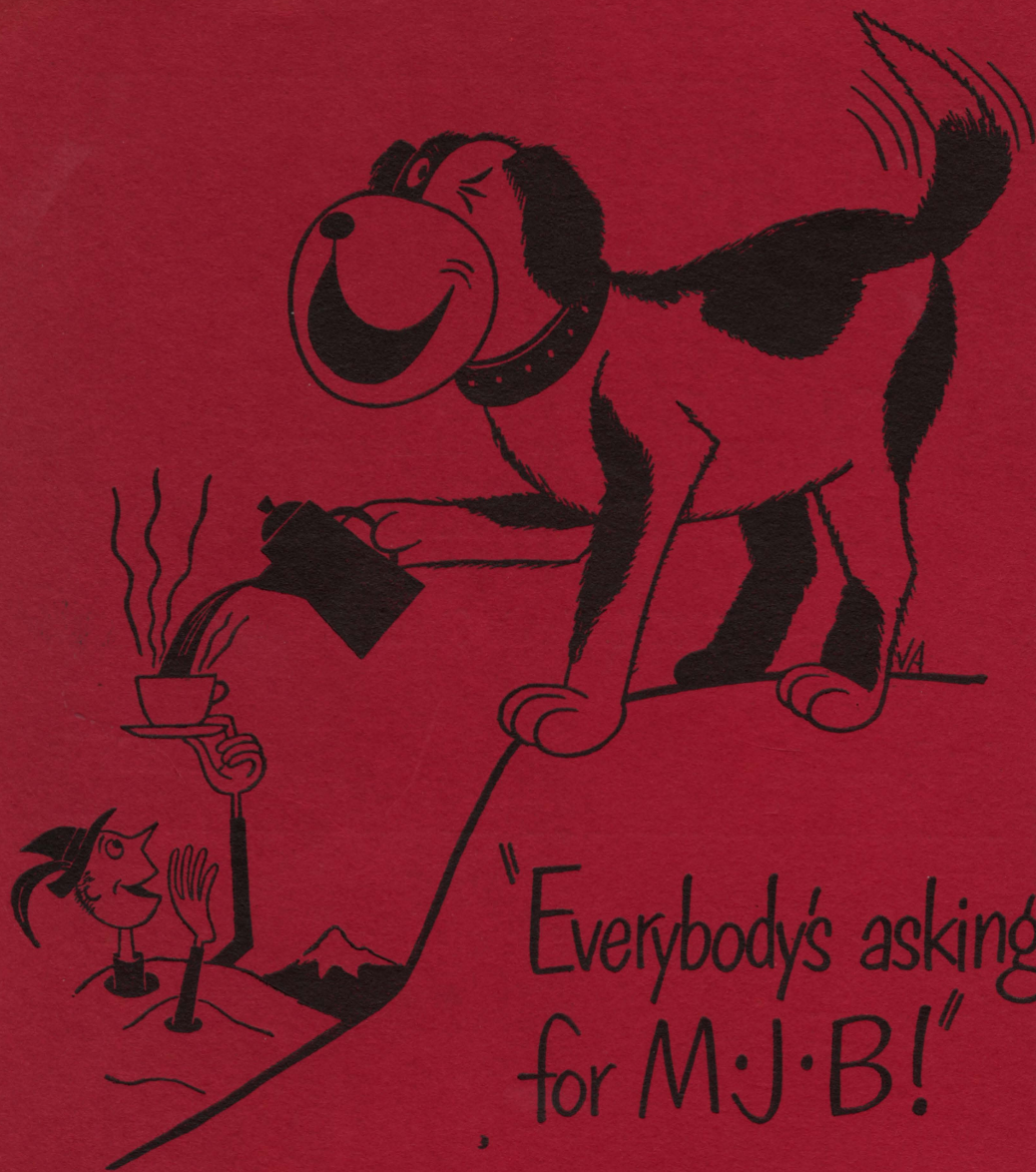
