CONTRIBUTION REPORT FOR QUARTER ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1938

This is your copy, keep in your files to facilitate verification by authorized representatives of the department. Make it an exact duplicate of the one mailed to the Department of Employment.

Send remittance with original return when mailing to the Department of Employment, 1025 P Street, Sacramento. Do not send remittance to a branch office. Do not send coin, currency or stamps. Send check, cashier's check or money order payable to the California Unemployment Reserves Commission for the full amount of the contribution.

Contribution is due and payable on October 1, 1938, and delinquent November 1, 1938. If remittance is not postmarked on or before midnight of October 31, 1938, interest charges of 12 per cent per annum must be assessed under the law. The Act contains no provision for waiver of interest.

11. **Failure to Sign Certificate Will Require A Supplemental Certificate Under Oath** Leave This Space Blank

Contribution Report form CURC-3 and informational Earnings Report form CURC-3A must be submitted with remittance to cover for each calendar quarter. If you had four or more employees during twenty different weeks in 1937 you are a subject employer in 1938, even though you have only one employee. If you paid no wages during this quarter, these reports must be filed and properly signed, with statement on the face of both the Contribution Report and the Earnings Report reading as follows: "NO WAGES PAID DURING THIS QUARTER."

Special Instructions for Completing Contribution Report CURC-3

(See General Instructions on Reverse of Schedule A)

Column P. A breakdown of money wages, shall be made for each month in the quarter. Money wages shall show the wages payable for all pay roll periods ending within each month of the period reported. Money wages includes salaries, commissions, bonuses, benefits paid from a sick fund maintained by employers or employers and wage-earners, dismissal wages, cash prizes, vacation pay and all other wage payments except wages or allowances paid in kind. Include also all deductions made from a wage-earner's pay check because of purchases made, payments made, or other advances made by employer for the benefit of the wage-earner, such as company store advances, insurance deductions, garnishments, merchandise purchases, charges for services, etc. Tips received by a wage-earner from patrons of the employer are not considered wages.

Column Q. A breakdown of other remuneration shall be made for each month in the quarter. Other remuneration means all wages or allowances in kind, such as board and lodging, room, board, meals, rent, merchandise prizes, and all other considerations of value except cash given a wage-earner in exchange for services.

Column R. Include the total number of covered workers in the last pay periods of all types of pay rolls ending within the month. Compute this figure by adding the number of covered workers on the last weekly pay roll, the second semimonthly pay roll, the monthly pay roll, and the last of any other type of pay roll, for example, daily, ten day, etc. The result is the total number of covered workers to be reported by the employer to the Unemployment Reserves Commission.

Item 1. After carrying total of Column P to space provided under total of Column Q, add to get Item 1. This total should agree with total of Item 23 on Schedule A. Under Item 1 two lines have been added. These are for your convenience in reconciling the amounts shown on Contribution Report with your total pay roll in case it included non-subject wages. Use of this space is optional.

Item 2. Check answer which applies. If wages in non-subject employment have not been reported the answer here should be "no" (x).

Item 3. Enter here the amount of employer's contributions figured at 2.7 per cent of Item 1.

Item 4. Wage-earners' contribution comprises total of all amounts actually deducted, during period reported, from wage-earners' wages as required by section 44 of the Act. The amount deductible during 1938 is 1 per cent of the wages paid.

Item 5. Enter the sum of Items 3 and 4.

Item 6. Enter here any adjustments. Additional payments must be supported by detailed schedules. Credits are not to be taken unless credit memo has been furnished you by the Department of Employment.

Item 7. Sub-total: Net total of Item 5 and Item 6.

Item 8. Enter here the amount of interest which has accrued between delinquent date and date of payment. Detail schedule must be submitted showing period covered. The law provides in section 45 for interest on delinquent contributions at the rate of 12 per cent per year. The Attorney General has held this to mean 1/365th of 12 per cent per day.

Item 9. Enter here the total payment due, the sum of Item 5, Item 6, and Item 8. Remittance covering this exact amount should be enclosed.

Item 10. This certificate must be signed by the employer, or a responsible agent or officer thereof. If certificate is not signed a supplemental certificate under oath will be required.

Item 11. Each employer subject to the Act for 1938, liable for contributions computed on his pay roll for 1938, must submit a contribution report (CURC-3) and an informational earnings report (CURC-3a) for each quarter during the year. If you had four or more employees during twenty different weeks in 1937 you are a subject employer in 1938, even though you have only one employee. CURC-3a is a substitute for DE-352a, which has been discontinued. If there is no subject pay roll during any particular quarter or quarters, a contribution report CURC-3 and an informational earnings report CURC-3a, must be returned marked "No wages paid during this quarter."
