



## Woman heads board

HAYWARD — Kimiko "Kimi" Fujii of Hayward has become the first woman president of the board of the Alameda-Contra Costa Transit District.

Miss Fujii had been the only woman ever to serve on the board, created in 1956. She was elected president last night after taking the oath of office for her new term from San Leandro-Hayward Municipal Court Judge Robert Fairwell.

Miss Fujii was appointed to the board in April 1972 to fill out the term of the late E. Guy Warren of Hayward. She was re-elected recently with a substantial majority.

Associated with the family wholesale nursery and its retail outlet on Soto Road, Miss Fujii is active in a number of community projects. She was named Hayward's Distinguished Citizen for 1972 by the Hayward Lions Club.

Other board members taking the oath of office last night were William J. Bettencourt of San Leandro, John McDonnell of Oakland and Chester C. McGuire Jr. of Berkeley.
