Helen was so glad to have one - She was  
always very heavy as she nurses in Jewish  
homes in D.C. and loved the rich food. She  
is confined to her room in her apt. on  
Sutter St. and has a companion with her.  
She had a stroke and her speech has come  
back and she is able to talk on the phone.  
If you could keep the picture in your  
file it shows that the flowers must stand  
higher than those in vases set in the ground.

These details Charlie would not think of -

Sun. we are to be at Ricks in Palo Alto for a 12 o'clock dinner. my brother is giving - Douglas and Marcia come Fri. night and will be staying there until Sun. aft. when they take a Seattle plane - It must be a year and a half or more since we have seen to Palo Alto. Douglas's class is having its 20<sup>th</sup> reunion. They spent 3 wks in Europe but were unable to get a line through to Lyon to talk to cousin Dr. John Huggins. They had just moved to a smaller apt. and the (high) land given their telephone no. and I said to c. I'll never be calling Lyon and that was I heard of Douglas's trip so they planned to phone the night they were to get back for a tour at 7 P.M. but didn't get in until 1 a.m. and the next morn. they were leaving for the Tyrol mts - but he wrote them a note and posted it - before they left. 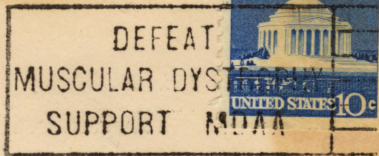
Long Winton
