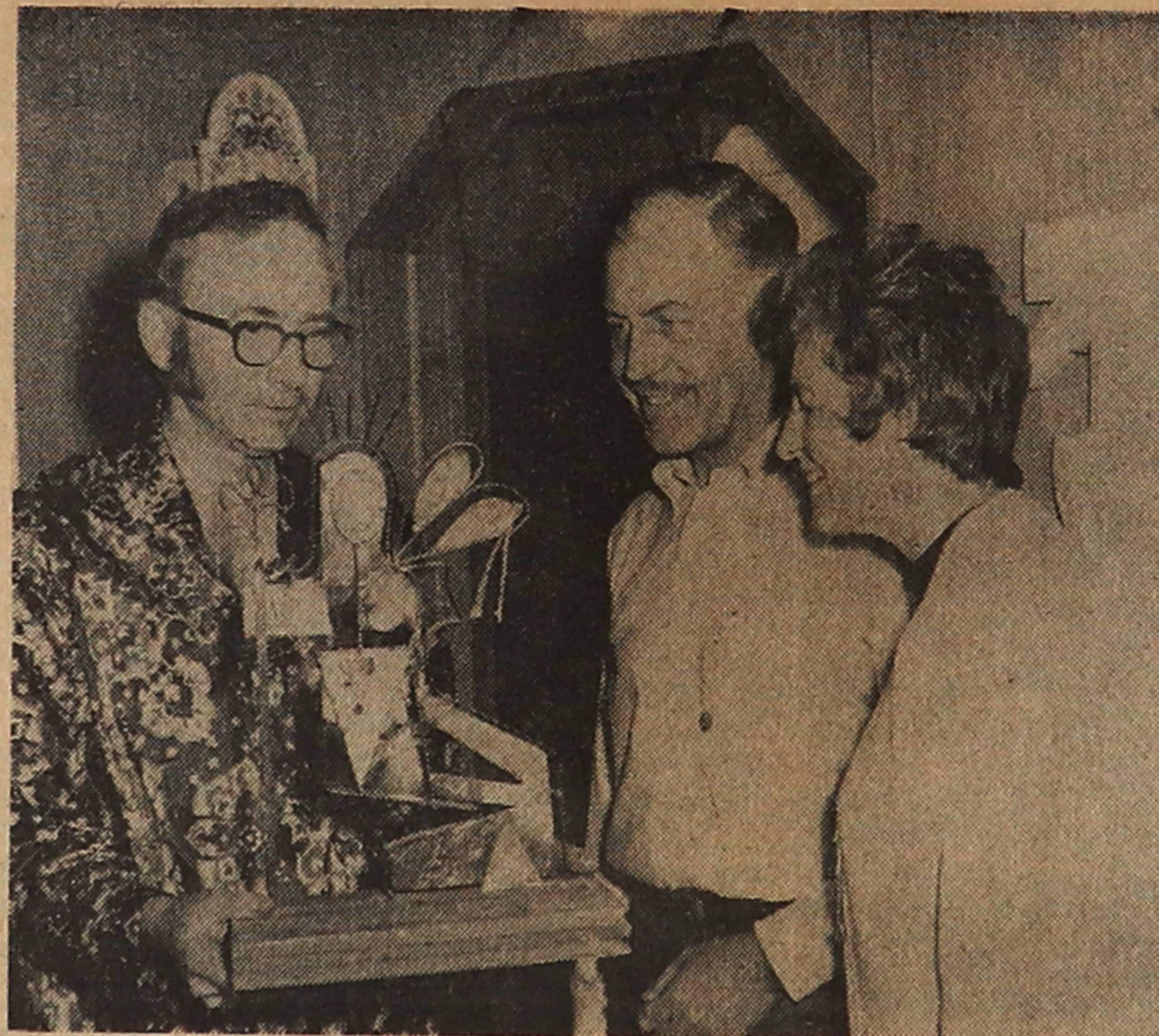

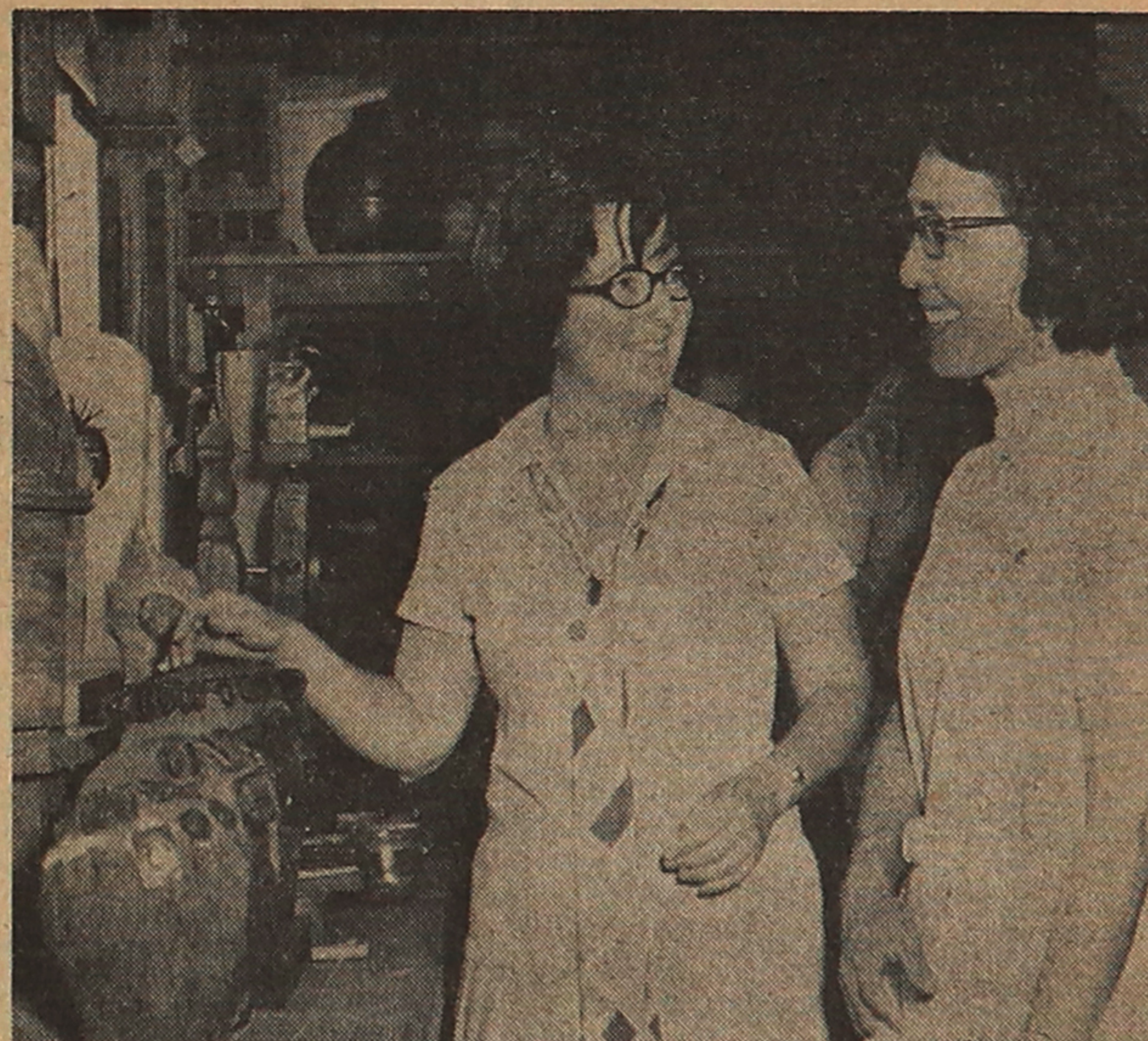

Studio tour rates raves

Committee members of the Hayward Festival of the Arts are beaming today about the success of their first studio tour on Sunday. Under blue skies and with glowing sunshine, the tour attracted some 250 people who trekked through the homes and gardens of three Castro Valley artists. Chairmen of the event, Mrs. Douglas Rodgers and Mrs. Robert Griffin, expressed pleasure at the excellent response to the works of artists Richard Brennan, Bob Atkinson and Sam Stanley. In addition to a wealth of his ceramic and metal sculpture, Brennan's garden was filled with about 300 bonsai trees, which he has recently begun cultivating. Multi-media artist Atkinson displayed his metal and bronze casting sculptures, wood carving, oil and acrylic painting, collages and lithography. Primarily a ceramic sculptor, Stanley also exhibited his works in marble, woods and oils. After enjoying the homes and works of the artists, guests gathered at the Botany Grounds behind the new City Center Building in Hayward for refreshments. The Botany Grounds will be the setting for the ninth annual Hayward Area Festival of the Arts, May 16 and 17. Funds raised from the studio tour support the art festival.
