Dear Mr. Stone:

I received a letter from my sister, the content of which is explained in the following paragraphs.

1 Enclosed in her letter was a copy of my father's death certificate which had been certified by Mr. Kasaki, a mayor of Furuichi City where my father was born.

2 Also enclosed was an exemplified copy of the will in Japanese. I am not certain whether this will is the original one or not until I hear from my brother. I am expecting a letter from him within a few days. You will find the direct translation of the will in a separate sheet.

I do not think both the death certificate and the will have been authenticated by an American Consulate official.

I would be in contact with you as soon as I have obtained the additional information.

1 If this will in Japanese<sup>E</sup> were translated into English by the official translator here, we may clarify whether it is an original one or not and also whether it was duly certified by a Japanese court officer.

2 It seems in my opinion that Mr. Yamasaki mentioned in the will may be a Japanese court officer.

3 I used my own discretion in translating some of the legal terms used in the will.

4 If you want the copies of both the death certificate and the will, in Japanese, I will send them to you.
