Beste - By air from Baton Rouge, Louisiana, to San Francisco, California, reporting upon arrival to the Office of Air Transport Command, 318 Stockton Street, for further movement by air on or about 11 October 1945 from Hamilton Field, California, to an overseas destination under Shipment IJ-BOO4-AV on temporary duty, and, upon completion of temporary duty, to return to Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

2. Prior to departure from the continental United States they will be required to have completed the prescribed immunizations in conformity with current War Department instructions.

3. Baggage:

a. Baggage to accompany each individual by air will be marked with the owner's full name, will be limited to sixty-five (65) pounds and will accompany the individual to the port of aerial embarkation. Baggage will not be marked so as to disclose the overseas destination.

b. Baggage to be shipped by water must not exceed one hundred ten (110) pounds each and must be shipped to the San Francisco Port of Embarkation marked with the owner's full name and additionally as follows:

SF P of E
SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF
FOR: IJ-BOO4-AV

Under no conditions will personal baggage be crated or boxed for shipment to the port.

4. Prior to departure from the continental United States, they will have in their possession the essential items of the prescribed uniform authorized for wear under applicable regulations. Regulations governing the procurement of uniform clothing in continental United States are published in Section II, WD Circular 282, 1945.

5. Immediately prior to departure for port of aerial embarkation they will advise correspondents that all mail will be addressed to them at APO 1764, c/o Postmaster, San Francisco, California. Upon arrival at destination overseas they will contact the nearest Army Post Office to arrange for receipt and dispatch of official and personal mail matter. Civilian personnel using an APO mailing address are not entitled to the free mailing privilege.

6. Travel by military and/or commercial aircraft and rail, plus pullman, is directed (3 b (2), AR 55-120, Change No. 13) except where other means of authorized travel are equally or more expeditious, and is necessary for the accomplishment of an essential or emergency war mission. In lieu of subsistence, a flat per diem of \$6.00 while within and \$7.00 while outside the continental United States is authorized each individual concerned, except Mr. George W. Beste, in accordance with existing law and regulations while traveling and absent from permanent station. No per diem is authorized while traveling on board ships where the cost of passage includes meals. Travel expenses and per diem allowances of all individuals on permanent duty are chargeable to 601-31 P 431-02 212/60425 S 99-999 and to 601-1 P 432-02 212/60425 S 99-999 for all individuals on **temporary duty**, except Mr. Beste. Actual transportation expenses of Mr. Beste **will be paid** and a per diem of \$10.00 in lieu of subsistence and other expenses will be allowed for the time of travel to and from the place or places of duty herein prescribed and for the time spent there in the performance of this mission. These are chargeable to 601-1070 P 432-02 A (212/60425) .220.

7.a. The Chief of Transportation, Army Service Forces, Washington, D. C., will issue a Certificate of Identification, WD, AGO, Form No. 65-11, to each individual, except Messrs. Beste and Johnson, with title of Bombing Research Analyst.

b. The Commanding Officer, Port of Aerial Embarkation, will issue a Certificate of Identification, WD, AGO, Form No. 65-11, to each Mr. Johnson and Mr. Beste with title of Bombing Research Analyst.

Upon the return of individuals to the United States, Certificates of Identification will be surrendered to the Commanding General of the Port of Entry.

8. The Chief of Transportation, Army Service Forces, and the Commanding General, Air Transport Command, will each furnish the transportation for which he is responsible and coordinate with all concerned.
