Dear Mr. Sai:

It is my pleasure to confirm the advice given you on Wednesday, May 20th, 1942, to the effect that Fourth Church will make available each Sunday from 2:00 to 3:15 P. M., the John Timothy Stone Chapel as a meeting place for the Japanese Christian Church which you are serving. It is our understanding that these accommodations will be used on the following conditions:

- (1) Meetings are to begin Sunday, May 24th, 1942, at 2:00 o'clock P. M.
- (2) The meetings are to be held on an experimental basis at first, to ascertain if the arrangement pleases both parties to it.
- (3) Fourth Church is to look to you as the person responsible for the conduct and supervision of each meeting.
- (4) The interests of Fourth Church in this matter are to be placed in the hands of a Committee selected from our Board of Deacons which will confer with you with reference to any matters that may arise.
- Any expense incidental to your conduct of the Japanese Church will be borne by its membership, exclusive of rent, heat and light for the accommodation.
- (6) If this arrangement pleases both parties, we shall be happy to continue it at least as long as you serve the Japanese church.

As for Sunday School accommodations, we should like your group to become a part of our own Bible School which meets each Sunday morning at 9:45 o'clock. They could have separate classes if you prefer.

It was kind of you to appear with Mr. Matsumoto at our Session meeting on last Wednesday evening. I regret that you were detained for such an extended period.
