There is enclosed herewith your travel document with military permit attached.

You are informed that the military permit is valid only if you depart from the United States on or before July 31. 1946.

Should you be unable to depart on or before the date referred to, you should communicate with this office explaining the reasons for your inability to depart and the arrangements, if any, which you have made for a later departure.

You should not sign your military permit until you appear before a departure control officer at the port of embarkation at the time of your departure.
