November 8, 1913 --- August 6, 1998

Ai Chih Tsai was born in Tainan Province, Taiwan, the seventh of nine children. He graduated from Doshisha University in Kyoto, Japan and from the University of Chicago Divinity School. Following his ordination in 1942, he assumed the ministry at the Japanese Church of Christ in Chicago. During World War II, Rev. Tsai worked for the U.S. Navy. After the war he worked for the U.N. Relief and Rehabilitation Administration. In 1948, he became the minister of the Japanese Congregational Church in Seattle where he served until his retirement in 1979. In 1985-86, he served as the interim minister of the JCC. During his thirty years of service, his ministry touched the lives of many families.

In 1942, he married Ryo Morikawa of San Diego. They have four children and seven grandchildren.
