Dear Mr. Conard:

I have just had forwarded to me, your letter of the 18th by Miss Trudy King with accompanying form stating material required to secure a travel permit.

I hope that by now you have been sent a letter from the University of Nebraska stating that I have been accepted in their Graduate College. Unfortunately, I have only a transcript of their letter of acceptance, my brother in Santa Anita having forwarded the original to the project manager here. I shall endeavor to obtain the original and enclose it with this letter; otherwise, I shall send you the letter sent me by my brother. Of course, if Dr. Goss of the University of Nebraska has written to you, that will be unnecessary.

I have already sent you a statement of financial resources verified by Mr. McCreedy; however, as it is less than \$1,000, I am sending an estimate of expenses for the year:

I have no sponsor at the University, but have been corresponding with Dr. Goss, Dean of the Graduate College; I have a friend, Mr. Roy Wiltshire, at 2315 R Street, Lincoln; he has no connection with the university, but has stated his willingness to help me find employment.
