When he was not quite nine, he was taken to a play, now forgotten, and was bitten by the bug. For the following few weeks, he bored through books on stagecraft and built a platform on his papa's pasture where he performed plays in make-believe. By the time he was ten, he was proficient enough to entertain his neighbor children with one-man matinees. At twelve he began to read the lives of all the actors and acresses he had ever heard of, and by the time he was fifteen, he knew all about Maude Adams, Zoe Akins, Allgood, Emil Jannings Eleanora Duse and John Drew, Richard Mansfield, xxxxxxxx and Bernhardt and Barrymore. and even of M Mrs. Barry and Betterton, Colly Cibber and Garrick, Kemble and Kean. Such was his diligence

Possessing Precocious talent, he shunned boyish sports, but no sissy was he as he twice demonstrated by breaking the beak of a bully who made mockery of his manhood (mocked his manhood) and by blackingxt blackening the eye of knakker a brute who taunted and tormented him.
