We, YOSHIO URAKAWA and MASAYE URAKAWA, husband and wife, being first duly sworn, upon our oaths say:

1. That we now reside at [redacted] King County, State of Washington, and have resided at this address for 12 years and have resided in the United States for 32 years.
2. That I, Yoshio Urakawa, was born on Feb. 22, 1905 at Miken, Japan, and have never been naturalized in the United States, but am a legal resident of the United States. That Masaye Urakawa was born on Nov. 15, 1906, at Fukui-Ken, Japan, and entered at Seattle, Wash. in Oct. 1918. That she never been naturalized in the United States, but is a legal resident therein.
3. That I, Yoshio Urakawa, arrived at the Port of Seattle, by the S.S. Panama Maru on April, 1919, and was duly admitted by the United Immigrant Inspectors for permanent residence.

4. That I am married and we have the following persons dependent upon my wife and myself for support-- Masaye Urakawa (wife), Marianne (Daughter) and Clara Jane (Daughter).
5. That my occupation (Yoshio Urakawa) is that of Maintenance man; that I am now and have been for the past 1 year employed by the Providence Hospital at 17th. & East Jefferson St. in Seattle, Washington; that my present wages or salary is \$185.00 per month; and that ~~my~~ ^{our} average earnings for the past five years have been approximately \$2300.00 per annum.
That I am not now engaged in any business for myself.
6. That I own the following described property which has a fair market value of the amount indicated and no encumbrance-
Residence at [redacted] (\$11,000.)
1947 Dodge Club Coupe (\$1200.00) all paid for; and savings deposits and checking account of about \$3000.00.
The residence at [redacted] stands in the name of my brother, Elmer Urakawa, but is actually my own, as I paid for it, and I have a full Power of Attorney from my brother. We have also the following other financial resource, to-wit- wife's wages of about \$40.00 a week, as waitress in Hunt Cafe, 1209 Jackson St., Seattle, Washington.
7. That it is our desire that the following named person be issued immigration visa and admitted to the United States-

8. That in consideration of the issuance of immigration visa to the person named herein and entry of such person into the United States, we hereby unequivocally guarantee to assume full responsibility him, and unequivocally guarantee that he will not in any manner become a public charge.

1. Yoshio Urakawa, further say, that my father, Tomohichi Urakawa, first entered the United States in 1905, and left for Japan about 1942. From 1923 to May, 1941, he and I operated the Olympia Cafe, at 114--1st. Ave. South, Seattle, Washington.

To my knowledge, my father's reputation was of the best at all times.

We further state, that we have read this affidavit and know the contents; that it is for the specific purpose of facilitating the admission to the United States, of Tomohichi Urakawa, father of affiant, Yoshio Urakawa; that we realize that any false statement made hereon may constitute the crime of perjury; and that we are obligated to carry out the responsibilities we herein assume.

The statements above made with reference to the time and birth of each of these affiants, are made from his or her own knowledge and information; but otherwise, all statements are within the personal knowledge of both of the undersigned affiants.
