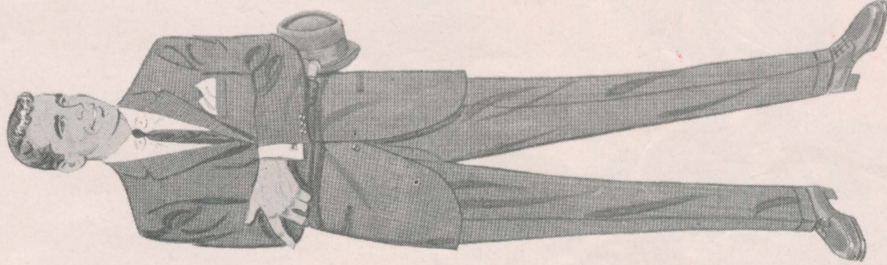

One of the most popular players in Red Sox history, Pesky has been managing in the Detroit Tigers farm system for the past five years. He led the Lancaster team to the Eastern League pennant in 1958, and directed Knoxville to the South Atlantic championship in 1959. Only once did he fail to finish in the first division. Pesky's appointment is the first made

by Neil Mahoney, new Red Sox farm director, and new vice-president Dick O'Connell. The Seattle Club was recently acquired by the Red Sox.

Pesky came to the Red Sox in 1942 and jumped into the record books as one of a handful of players who have made over 200 hits in their first major league season. Johnny had 205 hits and a .331 batting average, and established himself as the regular Red Sox shortstop before entering the Navy as a flier.

After three years in the Navy, he returned to help the Red Sox win the 1946 American League pennant with 208 hits and a .335 batting average. He continued with the Red Sox playing both short and third base until June of 1952, when he was involved in the nine player trade with the Detroit Tigers which brought George Kell to the Red Sox.

When his major league playing days were over in 1955, Pesky served as a player-coach under Ralph Houk with Denver of the American Association. In his first year as a manager in 1956, he directed Durham to a second place finish in the Carolina League. His 1957 Birmingham club of the Southern Association finished sixth, the only time any of his teams has failed to finish in the first division. Following pennants in 1958 and 1959 with Lancaster and Knoxville, he led Victoria into a tie for third in the Texas League this past season.

In signing his first contract to manage in the Red Sox organization, Pesky said, "I feel really great about coming back with the Red Sox, especially having the chance to work with old friends like Dick O'Connell and Neil Mahoney, and my former teammate, Mike Higgins."

## HOW TO KEEP SCORE

Half the fun at a ball game is keeping your own score. It's easy, if you follow a few simple rules.

Number each player as follows: (This has nothing to do with his uniform number, which appears BEFORE his name on the score card.)

- Pitcher .....1 Third Baseman .....5
- Catcher .....2 Shortstop .....6
- First Baseman .....3 Left Fielder .....7
- Second Baseman .....4 Center Fielder .....8
- Right Fielder .....9

Learn and use these abbreviations for plays:

BB—base on balls; H—base hit; Sac—sacrifice hit; F-fly ball; FI—foul fly; K—strike out; HP—hit by pitched ball; WP—wild pitch; PB—passed ball; E—error; SB—stolen base; FC—fielder's choice; FO—force out; BK—balk.

Examples: F-8—batter flies out to center field; E-5—batter reaches first on error by third baseman; 6-3—batter is thrown out at first by shortstop.

closed diamond as a miniature baseball diamond. The bottom point of the diamond represents home plate, the right hand point represents first base; the top point is second base; and the left hand point of the diamond represents third base.

To indicate how a batter moves around the bases, you merely darken the lines of the diamond showing where the runner has traveled. Then in the blank corners of each square containing the diamond, you indicate by the aforementioned abbreviations just how the man was advanced.

There are many variations of scoring procedure, but these variations are minor. Some scorers indicate hits as H-1, H-2, H-3 or H-4, others use short lines, pointing in the direction toward which the ball was hit.

But regardless of how you do it, it's fun to keep score . . . to take a personal part in each Rainier game for the 1961 season.

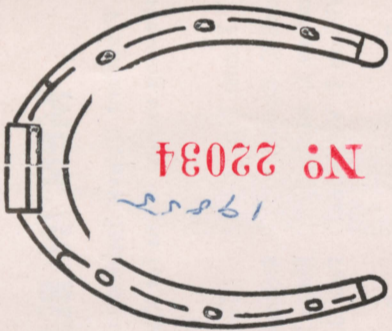

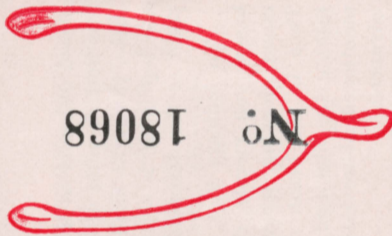

Briefs—When Charley Hiller moved in as Tacoma's keystone, coming from the San Francisco Giants—he was No. 6 to fill the second base position for the Tacoma nine this season, total personnel tops for the infield berth this year in the P.C.L. Dick Phillips, Bill Hain, Tony Frullo, Ernie Bowman and Milt Graff have been the others. Vancouver has had five fill in at second base, Salt Lake City and Hawaii four each, San Diego three, Seattle and Portland two with Spokane's Curtis Roberts having the lone perfect attendance through the games of July 13.

Milt Graff, by the way, is on Tacoma's disabled list, out indefinitely with pulled leg muscles.

Harry Mason is Hawaii's newest pitcher, a right-hander purchased from the Philadelphia system. He had a 4-1 record with an earned run average of 3.2 while hurling in eight games for Williamsport in the Eastern League when acquired by the Islanders. Mason turned in a neat two-hitter for a 7-2 short game win in a twin bill in Tacoma recently.

During the recent league meeting in Seattle, prior to the annual All-Star game, Pacific Coast League directors were optimistic about the league's future. League President Dewey Soriano estimated the attendance pickup at five per cent over a similar period last year and predicted a greater increase the last half of the season with a tight pennant race and perfect baseball weather prevailing throughout the league.

John Kubiszyn, who has been expected to join the Salt Lake City Bees last spring, is finally on the Utah roster, an optionee from Cleveland. Playing with Mobile last season he was the No. 2 hitter in the Southern Association at .336. He's moved into the shortstop spot defensively with the Hive and has taken over the No. 2 spot in the batting order.

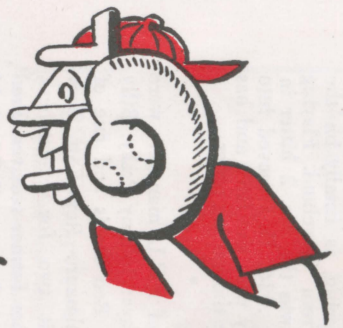
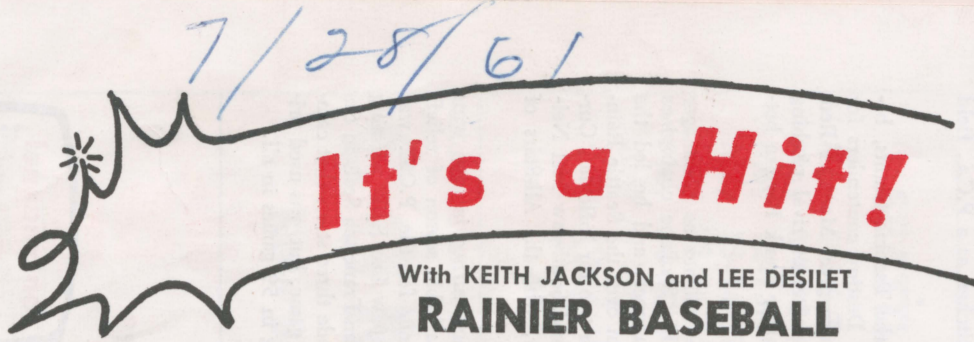
Five of the present crop of P.C.L. managers were infielders in their playing days: Johnny Pesky, Billy Hitchcock, Preston Gomez, Red Davis and one of the newest—Whitey Wietelmann. Ray Katt, new Portland skipper, makes it two for ex-catchers, Tommy Heath being the other former receiver. Fred Fitzsimmons is the lone ex-pitcher as a P.C.L. field chief.

Tom Haller is back with the Tacoma Giants, being switched to the City of Destiny contenders for John Orsino. The Haller return gives Manager Red Davis a batting switch to counteract rival pitching with Haller a southpaw swinger, Frank Reveira batting from the right side.

It's two-for-two for Preston Gomez as a manager in P.C.L. All-Star games, his Spokane champions beating the All-Stars last summer, and he led the All-Stars to their July 10 win over the Seattle Rainiers this time. It's also two-for-two for Infielders Curtis Roberts and Tony Roig and Southpaw Mel Nelson, with Spokane last year, with the All-Stars of 1960.

Portland's Ed Bauta has now turned in nine wins without a setback in a remarkable season of relief pitching. Last 20-game winner for the P.C.L. was another relief success, Southpaw Leo Kelly winning 21 while losing 6 with the San Francisco Seals in the 1957 pennant season. He made three starts that campaign, pitched one complete game, but was used primarily as a fireman, showing in 59 games in all.

# Pacific Coast League Franchise Shifts

Honolulu is the eighteenth city to hold a franchise in the Pacific Coast League since the 1903 inaugural. Six teams made up the original circuit: Los Angeles, San Francisco, Oakland, Sacramento, Seattle, and Portland. Only the last two have survived and neither has been in the P.C.L. every season since the opening. Seattle dropped out after 1906, didn't return until 1919. Portland has the marathon membership, missing only the 1908 season.

Over the years, other cities to be represented have included Fresno, Vernon, Venice, the Missions, Hollywood, Phoenix, Tacoma, Salt Lake City, Vancouver, B.C., San Diego and Spokane.

Tacoma and Salt Lake City, like Seattle and Portland, have been in and out of the P.C.L. Tacoma returned in 1960 after taking over the Sacramento franchise in the 1904-05 seasons while Salt Lake City was a league member from 1915 through 1925, returning in 1958.

The low mark for team franchises was

reached in the 1907-08 seasons when only four clubs operated: Los Angeles, San Francisco, Portland and Oakland.

The P.C.L. first went to eight teams in 1919, no franchise changes being made until 1925 when Salt Lake City's team was moved to Hollywood, the Vernon franchise to San Francisco's Mission district.

The Hollywood franchise was shifted to San Diego in 1936, the Missions moving into Hollywood in 1938.

Until the close of the 1955 season, the P.C.L. made no franchise moves, the

longest stretch without transition in its history. The next break came in 1956 when Oakland's team was shifted to Vancouver, B.C. Two years later big league baseball invaded Los Angeles and San Francisco and the Angels were moved to Spokane, the Seals to Phoenix and the Hollywood Stars to Salt Lake City.

The shift from Phoenix to Tacoma was made for the 1960 season; and now Sacramento, for the third time, has dropped out, the Solon franchise moving to Honolulu.
