The enclosed verifies that an individual was detained in a War Relocation Center during World War II.

In June 1983, the Commission on Wartime Relocation and Internment of Civilians recommended that the United States Government make a one-time payment of \$20,000 to each of the surviving persons who were excluded from their places of residence pursuant to Executive Order 9066. The Commission's recommendation is not based on the length of time a person was in a Center; the exact dates would not be required for payment. Before any payments are made, however, the United States Congress must enact legislation to authorize the payments and to designate an agency to process the payments. The Commission did not recommend compensation payments for loss or damage.

The National Archives and Records Service will continue to provide exact dates of detention when requested to do so by the Social Security Administration and other government agencies (Federal, State, and local). Individuals should apply directly to one of those agencies for benefits.
