"Ye are an epistle of Christ" II Cor. 3:3 Paul wrote a great many books which are found in the New Testament. They are called epistles, or letters which would be circulated among the members of a congregation or perhaps put on the bulletin board if they had one. one of his epistles he likens the Christian to an epistle. The Christian is likewise read by all men.

What do people read when they see you? Do you repel people from the Church? We hear people often say, "I don't go to Church because of so and so. " The one who critizes is reflecting his unconscious feeligg of superiority for he is comparing himself with the apparent failings of someone blue. He may be likened to the Pharisee in the New Testament. Most people think a Church is a fellowship of saints, but it is a fellowsnip of those who realize their sins and are humble enough to seek forgiveness and God's help. Perhasps likening it to a fellowship of sinners would be more apropos.
