REGISTRATION AND VOTING BY ABSENT ELECTORS

Registering

Section 132 of the Elections Code of California provides for the registration of an elector who is absent from his county of residence, but, of course, only a person who can definitely comply with the law's provisions as to registration is entitled to so register. The section authorizes mailing of the necessary forms to the elector, their completion and the taking of an oath before an authorized person and return of the forms to the County Clerk.

It must be borne in mind by persons seeking to avail themselves of the provisions of this section that our law requires that the elector's affidavit of registration not only show the registrant to be a resident of the county, but also the place of his residence with sufficient particularity to identify it and determine therefrom the voting precinct of the affiant. This refers to the individual's present residence - not his former residence. It seems clear, therefore, that a person, even though but temporarily absent from the county in which he claims residence, is not eligible for registration in that county unless he can definitely fix his place of residence therein.

An Alameda County elector who is temporarily away from home and who can meet this requirement as to residence should write to G.E.WADE, COUNTY CLERK, COURT HOUSE, OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA, for the necessary blank affidavits of registration, giving his home address and the address to which he wishes the blanks forwarded. Upon receipt thereof he should complete the forms and then have his affidavit taken:

- (1) If in the United States by any judge or clerk of any court of record, or notary public, or
- (2) If in a foreign country by any minister, consul, or vice-consul of the United States

and then return the affidavit to the County Clerk.

Voting

A registered elector who is away from home and desires to vote at an election conducted by county officials is required to make a written application for his ballot to the County Clerk. His application is to be received by the County Clerk not more than twenty days or less than five days before the day of the election at which he wishes to vote. Detailed information covering the method of voting will be forwarded with the ballot.

During 1942 two state wide elections will be held in California.
They are -

Direct Primary Election

August 25, 1942

Registration closes July 16, 1942


Application for absent voters ballots received between August 5 and August 20, 1942

General Election

November 3, 1942

Registration closes September 24, 1942
