Dear Charles,

I am very glad to hear from you. I have thought over your letter, but I am very sorry to say I can not do as you desire.

We are moving to Grand Junction Colorado next week to start farming there. There is no house there completed to live in and in the mean time there is no farming job there yet.

There are large peach orchards out there and I heard they need ^{many} men from the middle of August. Before that time there is a little vegetable jobs from April out there.

Now the northern part of Utah farm jobs are finished and the lower ~~part~~ jobs

are filled so the government does not give permits for the northern part of Utah.

I think it is better for you, to stay in camp till next spring or go to Chicago.

My friend is working there and says he is getting \$20000 clear a month.

Anyhow in the country, there are no farm jobs in the winter any where.
